## **Barnes Wins PBA Viper Championship**

Ciminelli's 7-10 split in 10th frame proves costly in second World Series of Bowling V event

LAS VEGAS, Nev. - Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, captured his 16th career title in the Professional Bowlers Association Viper Championship presented by PBA Bowling Challenge, defeating top qualifier Ryan Ciminelli of Cheektowaga, N.Y., 230-212. when Ciminelli left a 7-10 split in the 10th frame of the title match.

The second of seven telecasts from PBA World Series of Bowling V at the South Point Hotel and Casino complex aired Sunday on ESPN, and again featured the use of a unique "blue oil" on the lanes to help television viewers and on-site fans see the otherwise invisible lane conditioning pattern.

"It's way more fun winning than losing, and I've tried both," Barnes said of his second PBA Tour victory of the 2012-13 season.

England's Stuart Williams started the four-man Viper stepladder finals with a 203-194 victory over Australia's PBA Player of the Year contender, Jason Belmonte, but Barnes then eliminated Williams, 200-171, to advance to the title match.

Ciminelli jumped into a 15pin lead over Barnes after five frames, striking on four of his first five shots, and he maintained his lead heading into the 10th frame when disaster struck. He left the 7-10 split on a light pocket hit, and nearly converted the spare when he bounced the 7 pin out of the pit in front of the 10 pin. Barnes, working on strikes in the eighth and ninth frames, then locked up the title with two more strikes in his 10th frame.

"It was an awful shot," Ciminelli said of his fatal 10th-frame error. "I guess I could have gotten lucky and got nine or something, but you can't rely on that. You have to throw it good when you're in that position. I made all of my good frames irrelevant with one bad shot."

Barnes knew he got a break,

but predicted Ciminelli would return to the winner's circle soon.

"(Ryan) keeps getting better and better," Barnes said of the 27-year-old Ciminelli, who won his only PBA Tour title in Dublin, Calif., in January 2011.

"He's better in qualifying and better in match play, and he's getting better at finishing. He almost made the 7-10, which would have changed things considerably.

"Ryan's going to be one of the guys to beat and he's trying to step in as the premier lefthander on tour. I'm not sure (33-time PBA Tour winner and Hall of Famer) Parker (Bohn III) is ready to step aside right yet, but Ryan is certainly laying his claim to be that guy.'

Barnes also said the two previous right-handed players in the finals (Williams and Belmonte) had moved the oil around on the lanes, which forced him to make continuation moves around until he found a consistent shot to the pocket.

"I kept moving around and trying to make the ball hook, and eventually I got back to where I started and made some good shots," Barnes said. "It was kind of what you'd see (Hall of Famers) Walter Ray (Williams Jr.) or Norm (Duke) do - pick a spot and keep hitting that spot, and make the other guy show up."

The Viper Championship used the same blue oil used in the Cheetah Championship earlier in the World Series. The Viper pattern was applied to 39 feet compared an application to 35 feet for the Cheetah. The unique colored oil also will be used in the Chameleon Championship which airs on Dec. 15 at 1 p.m. ET and the Scorpion Championship telecast on Dec. 22 at 3:30 p.m. ET.

"I don't even see the oil when I'm bowling; I didn't continued on page 2

even notice it was there," Ciminelli said, but Barnes noted with a grin, "The funniest thing was, when I threw my spare ball, it disappeared (his spare ball is light blue, almost the same shade as

"On one of these (blue oil) shows, if all of the guys play in the same area of the lane, I think we'll see much better how the condition will get lighter," Barnes added, "but this show was like the U.S. Open. One guy was playing first arrow, another was playing fourth arrow, one playing the 12 board, so it was hard to see (the movement of oil).

"I'm not sure what we'll learn from it, but I don't have a problem with it at all," he added. "It doesn't really create any kind of advantage for what we do because we're still going to rely on what we know. We don't know enough about (the blue oil) to trust our eyes over our feel for the lanes."

The Viper telecast also included a segment called "Time to Strike," the second of four special PBA League Challenge segments in which the eight PBA League franchise players are demonstrating their skills in unique competitions. In the second round, players tried to throw as many strikes as possible within a span of 90 seconds.

'Speed bowling is not for me," said 51-year-old Hall of Famer Pete Weber, franchise player for the New York City WTT KingPins, who threw two strikes. "Go back 30 years, maybe."

"I thought I was going to rule that one," the Dallas Strikers' Duke noted, "but I ended up dead last with no strikes. I could hear Chris Berman in the background saying, Come on, man!'

"I did really well in the speed challenge," said Philadelphia Hitmen representative Bill O'Neill, who won the competition in a two-shot roll-off against L.A. X franchise player Jason Belmonte after each had thrown five strikes in the 90-second round. "Apparently that's how I need to bowl from now on. When I pick my ball up and think for a second, things go haywire, so I've got to just get up and run to the line.'

Next Sunday's Chameleon Championship finals include top qualifier Dom Barrett, England; No. 2 qualifier Brian Kretzer, Dayton, Ohio; No. 3 Ciminelli and No. 4 Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Mich. The telecast also will include a PBA League "Obstacle Bowling" Challenge, calling for players to knock down as many pins as possible with three shots in or around rubber bowling pins placed on the lane.

A post-finals look at the Viper Championship and a preview of the Chameleon Championship, along with other features, will be available Monday on "The Bowling Center" on YouTube.com. Xtra Frame subscribers who may have missed Sunday's telecasts will be able to watch the finals "on demand" in the Xtra Frame archives one week after the original show airs.

## NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

#### DON SEVER WINS MEN'S DSBA MATCH PLAY CLASSIC AT LAS VEGAS

LAS VEGAS — With previously told stories of the 17th annual Deaf Senior Bowlers of America tournament held last October 15-17 at the Orleans Hotel and Casino Bowling Center. We mentioned that Renwick Dayton, OR as men's Singles winner, Francine Lauer-Skedsmo, CA, as women's Singles winner, Wilbur Wright, CA & Domingo Gloria, NV as winners of Mixed Doubles. We did not have the All-events winners and Kathy Seymour, CA won her 2nd DSBA Women's Match Plays title.

Last week this writer almost finished this story of men's Match plays Qualifying round and the Match play rounds, only to find it gone, disappeared from my screen. After two days of futile trying to bring it back and later with Apple Support's help, all we got back was the top 6 lines. Apple's advice was to punch in "Save" every two paragraphs. So the story is rewritten.

On Wednesday morning Oct. 16 Wilbur Wright, CA led the 44 men's qualifying round of DSBA Match Play Classic with games of 215-201-185-160 for 761 plus his 156 handicap for 917. Two bowlers, Bob Jones, CA and Barry Cossman, NV with over 210 averages and zero handicap qualified for the top 32 men Match Play event, Jones made 13th with high game 236-206-194-188 for event's high scratch 824 while Cossman placed 28th with his 223 in his 771 score. The eventual winner Don Sever, CA had qualified 10th with (223) 760 plus 72 handicap 832 and Bob Taylor. CA made 7th with his (204) 755 plus 88 handicap 843. The Singles event winner Renwick Dayton, OR qualified 12th with706 plus 124 handicap 830 and 32nd last place qualifying score was 753 by Bob Bergan, CA.

On Thursday morning Oct. 17, the double elimination Match Plays began with Cossman giving Dayton his first loss in first round. Bergan also lost with 14 others in first round. Then Cossman lost in 2nd round and was eliminated in third round. Meanwhile Wright, Jones, Sever and Taylor won their 1st and 2nd rounds matches. Then in round 3 Wright suffered his first loss and Jones, Sever and Taylor kept winning their matches.

In round 4 Taylor won his match and Sever beat Jones by 3 pins 196-193. In 5th round 0nly Taylor and Sever with 4 wins and no loss, met and Sever gave Taylor his first loss. Sever moved into Championship finals while Taylor moved to losers bracket semi finals. In the Loser Bracket, Dayton won two matches, eliminated Bergan in 4th round and won two more matches for a total of 5 in row. In 4th and 5th rounds Wright resumed his winning ways and in 6th round eliminated Jones who had won his previous match. In 7th round Wright met the hot Dayton and eliminated him 242 to Dayton's 183. Then Wright moved into the semi finals (8th round) against Taylor and won 218 to Taylor's 208

In the title finals against the waiting Sever, Wright who just won 5 matches in row, gave Sever his first loss by one pin 210-209. But Sever came back and beat Wright in the decider 239 to 200 to win his first DSBA title. All match games were with handicap. Wright ended up in 2nd place, Taylor placed 3rd and Dayton fourth. Defending champion Dennis Kaufman, CA and former champions (2011) Ted Thomas, NE, (2010) Gorman Low, CA and (2005) Walter Holder, TX had qualified and eliminated. Only Thomas stayed longer being eliminated by Dayton 201-196 in 6th round.

In the DSBA general meeting on Tuesday evening Oct. 15, the members voted to lower the men's entry age from 55 to 50 effective in 2014. Last year it was voted for women's age at 50. Next year's tournament will be at The Orleans Hotel and Casino on Tuesday-Thursday October 14-16, 2014. Tell all your senior friends.

## Dean of Bowling Writers, PBA & USBC Hall of Fame

Too often bowling has been depicted as an activity that has overcome a sordid past.

As a youngster I sort of reluctantly accepted the oft repeated tales of drinking and gambling and assorted other ills as the main lure of the game, and not the thrill of rolling a ball and knocking down more pins than the other bowl-

Early in my writing career I met some people who were involved with the early days of the sport and others who were related to or knew some of the pioneers of the game. One day a fellow sportswriter handed me a package, told me that an older woman had dropped it off for me and if I didn't want it to just throw it away.

It was a scrapbook of bowling articles that appeared from 1900 to 1905. I was surprised, fascinated, and proud, and eagerly devoured every word. It was all positive, maybe by design, maybe because that's the way it was. It had many a piece about women's bowling, informative, educational, and illustrative of a larger role women played than eve imagined.

Serving on various Hall of Fame and other committees I had the opportunity to peruse long ago publications and articles about the sport plus much of the research done by bowling scholars such as Al Matzelle, Bruce Pluckhahn and Herm Weiskopf.

Since there was some gambling, drinking, plenty of needling, lip action, equipment tampering and all the rest that goes with the building of a sport, but there also was the touch of class given by builders, engineers, women, churches, athletic and social clubs and people from every walk of life.

#### **IDLE BOWLING THOUGHTS**

. You can never tell about lane conditions and what effect they may have. There have been weeks on the national pro tour TV finals four top stars averaged a mere 201. And a week later, with four top stars they averaged 262

... There is no bowling crisis, major or minor, local or national, to which bowling will not respond to with a meeting, a conference or a seminar.

... Records are made to be broken though some can only be tied. But the Johnny Petraglia astounding career mark of at least one national title in six decades is one that could stand for a lot of years into forever. One of the first hurdles is to remain healthy enough over those many vears

... No sport brings male and female bowlers closer in competitive and social settings better than bowling, for people of all ages for amazing long times.

... My first heroes in bowling were Andy Varipapa, Junie McMahon, Lou Campi, Lindy Faragalli and Marion Ladewig. Who were yours?

... I like the story about the two men, one an ardent but strugging bowler and the other an average working man, who each won \$5 million in a lottery. When asked what they planned to do with the money, the working man said he was going to quit his job, spend a lot of time fishing and playing golf and take life easy, living on his new found wealth. The bowler scratched his head, thought a bit, then said, "I guess I'll just keep bowling in every tournament, I can — until the money runs out."

## **The Perfect Game**

by Steve Felege

Interview: The Final Chapter by The Grand Mama-Mancini

Editor's note: Over the past couple weeks we have been discussing inferior bowling techniques and universal bowling principles. Today I promise to conclude this interview by allowing Steve to explain how principles, theory and technique fit together to improve accuracy and consistency. This ought to be good!

Carol: All this talk about universal principles, theories and technique is starting to make my head hurt. Can you sort it all out?.....But please keep it simple.

Steve: You want simple? I'm your guy!

Carol: Start by reviewing the stance you claimed was "awful".

Steve: The shoulders are level. The ball is held waist-high, dead-center to the body and supported by both hands. The feet are several inches apart; one is placed slightly farther back than

Carol: And this is bad because.....?

Steve: To begin with, it's symmetrical but an approach isn't. A delivery involves swinging a heavy weight from one side only. Switching from symmetry to asymmetry while walking is a recipe for inconsistency. There are other problems with that stance as well.

Steve: The second thing is the shoulders are level to the floor. Whoever came up with that advice had obviously never watered cows before!

Carol: What?

Steve: I told you I've slept in worse places than your broom closet.

Carol: Yes you did, but what does watering cows have to do with bowling?

Steve: If you have a bunch of thirsty cows and only one five-gallon bucket, that bucket full of water soon becomes very heavy. If you try to keep your shoulders level, you quickly tire. After just a few trips to the well, your weight-bearing shoulder begins to droop. Making matters worse, the bucket brushes against your leg and throws you off-balance. Now, if you dip your shoulder straight down, you don't tire as quickly and the bucket doesn't hit your leg. You can walk straighter and faster without spilling a drop. My point? It's only natural to dip your shoulder when carrying a heavy weight from it. Why treat the swing of a bowling ball any differently? I champion "dipping" the shoulder because it makes sense.

Carol: I wish I had known that when I was younger. I was always being scolded for dipping my shoulder.

Steve: Me too, but the reality is that when you dip your shoulder, your head moves to that side. To stay perfectly balanced, your hips move in the opposite direction. With the hips out of the way, a path is cleared for your arm to consistently swing like a pendulum. There are other advantages to dipping the shoulder, but you want me to keep this short.

Carol: Those are in your book though, aren't they?

Steve: Of course. The third problem with the traditional stance is the ball is held dead-center to the body. It isn't aimed at anything! The bowler is simply standing there holding the ball like a kid holding a bag of candy on Halloween night and hoping for the best.

Carol: Anything else?

Steve: You bet! In the old stance, the feet are inches apart and your weight is evenly distributed on them. This placement of the feet requires you to shift sideways, to one foot or the other on your first step. Carol, the target-line only moves straight forward. There is NO ROOM for sideward movement of any kind because it absolutely destroys consistency. The traditional stance is improved by keeping the feet close together and placing all your weight on only one of them. This is still perfectly balanced, but now everything is set to move straight forward along your targetline. My book discusses other advantages this simple modification produces.

Carol: But if I'm a coach who agrees that any stance will work....?

Steve: Then you don't need me. The AJBC/AMF instructor had correctly stated that the delivery consists of a stance, push-away, arm-swing, and release. But he failed to teach those as separate skills. When you think of it that way, the pieces quickly begin to fall into place. The most important universal truth of bowling is, "The ball travels a line." Therefore, theoretically, the very best stance/push-away/arm-swing/ release combination must get the ball on that line......AND KEEP

Carol: The traditional stance doesn't do that!

Steve: Exactly. When you develop an approach which does that, the chances of your ball hitting its target improve dramatically. That target-line is established in the stance and begins at your shoulder; the point from which the ball swings. The old-style stance has you holding the ball offline; it is in line with your chin, not your shoulder. To improve your stance, make sure the ball is held off to the side, directly over your target-line.

Carol: That makes sense. Who taught you to coach like that?

Steve: Ben Hogan.

Carol: He was a golfer!

Steve: One of the best ever. He wrote a book called, "Five lessons of Modern Golf". In it he states that the swing of a golf club consists of five basic skills; the grip, the stance, the back-swing, the down-swing and the follow-through. Sound familiar?

Carol: Surprisingly, yes.

Steve: When I first read that, it was like being struck by lightning. What Ben Hogan had done was take a complicated subject and broken it into simple pieces. He then taught each piece as a basic skill. That strategy was genius. I immediately realized it was also the best way to teach people how to bowl.

Carol: So you adopted Ben Hogan as the father of bowling technique?

Steve: Ironic, huh? But we digress......

Carol: I hate golf, but I'm beginning to like this Ben Hogan fellow. Is he married?

Steve: Carol!!!

Carol: Okay, let's wrap this up.

Steve: Of course. The main point is that an infinite number of stances are possible, but only one can be the very best. Part of my quest was to define what that one might be.

Carol: And you believe you found it?

Steve: Reality dictates that a stance shouldn't cause consistency problems. It's the primary skill. The stance I prescribe solves a lot of problems rather than causing them. Is it the very best? I don't know......but that's one of the beauties of being a bowling coach; the door is always open


