USBC Cup Highlights PBA’s Six-City Eight-Tournament 2019 Summer Tour Schedule on FloBowling

Series will include \$40,000 USBC Cup points competition and concludes with multi-event FloBowling PBA Summer Swing

CHICAGO – Expanding upon what already will be an historic year of competition, Professional Bowlers Association CEO and Commissioner Tom Clark today announced a six-city, eight-tournament summer series as part of the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour schedule that will include a \$40,000 USBC Cup points competition.

The 2019 PBA Summer Tour will award eight PBA Tour titles beginning with the 20th anniversary PBA/PWBA Striking Against Breast Cancer Mixed Doubles in Houston in July and continuing with stops in Chesapeake, Va.; Wilmington, N.C.; Middletown, Del., and Coldwater, Ohio, before ending in late August with the FloBowling PBA Summer Swing which will include two animal pattern events and the Aurora Open finale in Aurora, Ill. Complete tournament schedules and formats will be announced later.

Open to PBA members as well as non-members, all eight events will be streamed live from first ball to last by PBA Xtra Frame on FloBowling. For subscription and schedule information visit www.flobowling.com.

All summer tour events except the Aurora Open will be classified as Tier 3 points events under the PBA’s Tier 1-2-3 points system. The Aurora Open will be a Tier 2 event. The top five PBA members at the end of the summer tour will share in the \$40,000 USBC Cup prize fund – including \$20,000 to the points leader.

The USBC Cup points bonus, sponsored by the United States Bowling Congress, will be part of the summer tour for the next three seasons.

All competition points earned during the summer tour will also apply to 2020 DHC PBA Japan Invitational and 2020 PBA Tour Finals eligibility.

PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: MIKE BAILEY WINS BEAUMONT SOUTHWEST OPEN

BEAUMONT – Mike Bailey from Irving, Texas, defeated Anthony Lavery-Spahr of Pasadena, Texas, 258-202, in the position round final match to win the 17th annual PBA Beaumont Southwest Open at Crossroads Bowling Center in Beaumont, Texas, Sunday. The victory was Bailey’s seventh in PBA Regional competition and his second in 2018.

Bailey battled Lavery-Spahr for the lead through most of the match play finals, but trailed Lavery-Spahr by 78 pins before the final game. With the 30 bonus pins awarded for winning the match, Bailey made up the deficit with a 258-202 win to claim the \$2,500 first place check.

Bailey finished the event 18 pins ahead of Lavery-Spahr’s 4,853. Houston’s David Scardaville finished in third place.

- Mike Moore and non-PBA member partner Shawn Naumann, both of Orlando, Fla., defeated Cristian Azcona of Puerto Rico and non-member Justin Dunn of Deland, Fla., 451-335, in a total pinfall match to win the \$4,000 first prize in the PBA South Region Member/Non-Member Doubles at Break Point Alley Bowling Center in Tavares, Fla., Sunday. Moore and Naumann won six of their eight matches and finished with a 16-game total of 7,042 pins to qualify first. Azcona and Dunn, who shared \$2,000 for second place, eliminated Dave Stouffer of Lehigh Acres, Florida, and Lee Rathjen of Naples, Fla., 446-377, in the first stepladder match.

- Harry Sullins of Chesterfield Twp., Mich., defeated top qualifier Mike Steil of Wheeling, Ill., 224-194, to win the PBA50 Victory Lanes Midwest/Central Open at Victory Lanes in Kankakee, Ill., Sunday. The tournament was Rich Weber’s final tournament as PBA Midwest Region tournament manager. Weber will officially retire on December 31. Sullins, who earned \$1,500 along with his 36th overall PBA Regional title and his fourth at Victory Lanes, defeated Gary Alstott of Washington, Ill., 267-214, in the semifinal game to advance to the championship match after Alstott eliminated Brian Kretzer of Dayton, Ohio, 234-221, in the first match.

- Scott Kinkaid of Elizabethtown, Pa., defeated Steven Kotowski of Clark, N.J., 278-236, to win the PBA MJK Pro Shop/Knob Hill Eastern Challenge presented by Brunswick in Manalapan, N.J., on Saturday. PBA Challenge events are open to any member or non-member who has never won a PBA event. Kinkaid, a 44-year-old non-PBA member, was bowling in his 12th PBA event. He qualified sixth and then dominated the field in the bracket elimination finals. He posted 6-1 record, averaging 262.4 over the seven games. Kotowski, also a non-member who was competing in only his second PBA event, posted a 5-2 record. Kinkaid earned \$1,500 for the win, but does not receive credit for a PBA Regional title because he is a non-member. In the semifinal matches, Kinkaid topped Michael Markis of Tafton, Pa., 269-234, and Kotowski defeated Jeremy Milito of Holbrook, N.Y., 223-214.

- As the PBA heads toward the year-end holidays, a limited schedule of PBA Regional competition is on tap for the Dec. 14-16 weekend, including the Reality Check/CareHawk South Classic at Sawgrass Lanes in Tamarac, Fla., and the Warren Harley-Davidson Central-East Challenge for non-title winners at Freeway Lanes of Warren, Ohio.

- Closing out PBA’s 2018 regional calendar will be the PBA50/PBA Houston Emerald Bowl Doubles presented by Bowling Dynamix over the Dec. 21-23 weekend, and the PBA Japan Region’s Scorpion and Women’s Scorpion Open tournaments at Tokyo Hagashiyamato Grand Bowl.

Warning to Beginners: Sometimes Bowling Doesn't Always Start On the Right Foot

WINNETKA – Ouch! Not all beginners to league play will make their indelible mark like Barb Dasaro. Of course, it's unlikely anyone would want to.

But give credit to Barb – five years later and she's still bowling, and she can still joke about the incident.

It was an experience that Barb acknowledges was no less than horrific for her but has since become just a small blip in time.

"Only I could do that," she says. At the time, Barb was toting a sturdy 13-pound bowling ball about six months after she joined her first league at Winnetka Bowl.

Then disaster struck. As Barb tells it: "I'm such a klutz that when I went to bowl, the ball slipped out of my hand. I dropped it on the person on the next lane, breaking her toe in two places.

"When I do a job, I really do it right. I was so mortified, I said, 'I'm sorry and I'll pay for the days that you're off.'" The unlucky victim was Bev Zietz.

"I wrote her a letter of apology and gave her flowers," Barb says.

Bev brushed off the incident even though the injury to her big toe on her left foot immediately sidelined her from bowling for three months. "Bev told me, 'You didn't do it on purpose.' She's a very sweet lady,'" Barb said.

Contacted about the injury, Bev just smiled at the memory. "She really knows how to take out the competition," she deadpanned.

Then Bev added: "I felt as bad for her as I did for me. It was just an accident."

Bev said she appreciated Barb's flowers and her accompanying letter of apology. "I still have that note," said Bev, beaming.

Barb has gone on to become a league favorite for her good humor and disposition. She's been averaging 130 to 140 through the years.

Her bowling highlight came when she rocked a 208 a year ago.

"I was getting strikes and strikes," says Barb, a West Hills resident. "Sometimes, you can't do anything wrong and sometimes you can't do anything right. I couldn't believe [the 208]. It was fun."

She also has bowled an even 500 series – which earned her a commemorative pin for reaching that level. When she was presented with her honor, a disbelieving Barb asked, "What did I get a pin for? Attendance?"

Barb says she joined her bowling league as a way of finding another post-retirement outlet besides dancing and her other activities. "I'm not very competitive. I don't go to Vegas. This was a way of my expanding my horizons and meeting people and having fun. I worked at Blue Cross for 36 years and was tired of being restricted. When I retired, I got into bowling and started crocheting and volunteering at the Cancer Foundation," says Barb, who is 75 and looks many years younger.

"If I knew I was going to live this long, I would have taken better care of myself," she jokes.

She now has a healthy outlook on that stomach-turning dropped-ball incident. "I started bowling with a bang," she says with a laugh. "But all is forgiven, and all is well."

come so close so many times and not come away with a gold medal before today,” Hupe said. “This definitely is a nice way to end the week and being able to successfully defend the title was pretty cool. I think this tournament emphasizes that we are being a team to take note of, and we’ll continue working to improve.”

It was a tough road to the gold medal for Hupe, who qualified for the Masters match play as the No. 20 seed in the all-events standings. He received no byes and had to bowl every round.

In his opening match, Hupe defeated fellow PBA bowler JoJoe Yannaphon, 2-1, before then taking down all-events winner and No. 1 seed EJ Tackett of the United States, 2-0. In the third round of match play, Hupe upset No. 2 seed Andrew Anderson of the United States, 2-1, despite falling behind 1-0 in the match.

In the semifinals, Hupe took on countryman Dan MacLelland and won that match, 2-0, on wins of 199-176 and 224-221. Troup, meanwhile, defeated Ireland’s Christopher Sloan, 2-0, in the other semifinal on games of 230-226 and 245-220.

ships and was the defending champion, while outside of one medal, Italy has no history of success in the event.

Those factors combined to create one of the biggest upsets in World Championships history for the Italian squad of Pierpaolo De Filippi, Antonino Fiorentino, Marco Parapini, Nicola Pongolini, Marco Reviglio and Erik Davolio.

In the opening game of the gold-medal match, the United States had a chance to win after Italy left a 4-9 split in the ninth frame. That gave Tommy Jones a chance to throw two strikes and get six pins on the fill to win Game 1.

Jones, however, stepped up and left a 4-6-7-10 split when the ball checked up and went high in the final frame, handing the victory in the first game to the Italians.

In the deciding game, Italy started with a double to take the lead and never trailed. In the sixth frame, with the match still within a mark, Team USA’s Chris Barnes left the 1-2-4-8 after flagging the headpin right. On the spare, the ball took off and he missed the spare left, only knocking down the 4-8 for the first open frame of the match.

Up 19 going into the ninth and working on a strike, Italy delivered a clutch double to build on its lead going into the final frame. In the ninth frame for Team USA, EJ Tackett left a wicked ringing 10 pin, essentially sealing Team USA’s fate.

Italy’s anchor bowler needed just seven pins on his first shot in the 10th to lock up the win and came up a little light, leaving an 8 pin, and the Italians celebrated their huge upset victory.

In the semifinal, Italy faced a tough test from Canada, another top team filled with current and former professional bowlers. That match went the distance with Italy winning, 2-1, after taking the first game 176-162 and the third game 190-179. Canada won Game 2, 244-210.

With a chance to put the pressure on Italy in the deciding game, Canada’s Dan MacLelland stepped up first in the final frame and if he struck out, Italy would need a double to win. MacLelland came up a little light and left a 2-4-10 split and missed it, allowing Italy to coast to the victory.

In the other semifinal, Team USA had little trouble disposing of a tough Singapore team, sweeping the match 2-0. The U.S. took the first game 238-194 and won the second game 216-189 to setup the match with Italy.

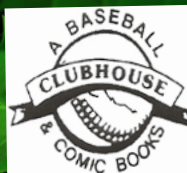


