GARDEN GROVE — Cheryl Huntington, manager of the Orange County/USBC/Association said, "Our annual BVL tournament will be held during the month of January".

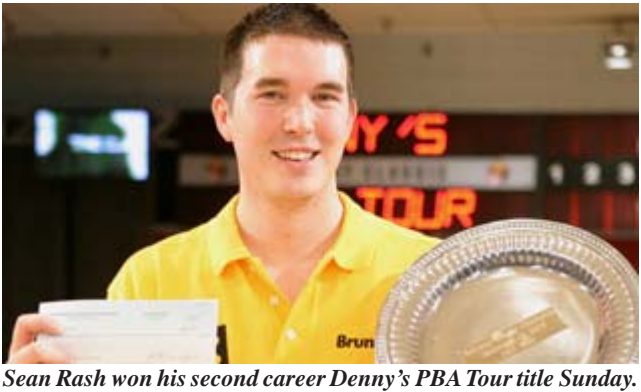

The Kid Can Roll

BALTIMORE—In less than a year, Sean Rash has gone from a struggling qualifier with a lot of potential to one of the top young bowlers on the Denny's PBA Tour.

Rash, who late last season became the first non-exempt bowler to win a Tour title, defeated PBA Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III, 279-225, to win the 2006 Beltway Classic at AMF Country Club Lanes for his second career title.

The 24-year-old combined for 18 strikes in his final 19 frames over his semifinal and final matches, dominating the 30-time titlist Bohn in the title match.

Rash got a break in the semifinal against Danny Wiseman, falling behind after Wiseman struck in the first five frames while Rash couldn't carry and started with four consecutive nine-spares. Wiseman missed a 10-pin in the 6th frame, however, and Rash responded with seven consecutive strikes to advance to the title match, 256-236.

"My first couple shots were pretty good in the first game. After I threw a bad shot in the 4th frame I told myself to regroup, get one break and see what happens. I just believed in what I was doing and took advantage of the opportunity I got," said Rash (Wichita, Kan.). "I bowled two great bowlers. Parker's a Hall of Famer and Danny will be someday. When you're bowling those two guys you can't think about bowling them, you have to bowl the lanes. You can't control what they do."

In last February's West Virginia Championship, Rash advanced to the field of 64 through the Denny's PBA Tour Qualifying Round, then became the first qualifier to win a title, earning an exemption for the 2006-07 season.

On Sunday, Rash struck in the first six frames of the title

TENPIN SLANTS

The Professional Bowlers Assn. makes its only California stop this season when Dave Osborn's Fountain Bowl host the Denny's PBA Dick Weber Open Jan. 16-21.

It will be the second year that this event—which honors the late legendary bowler—is being staged at the 60-lane Orange County center. The defending champion is lefty Jason Couch of Clermont, Fla.

The Dick Weber Open features the "old" format, in which those surviving the qualifying round will meet in round-robin match play. ESPN will televise the stepladder finals on Sunday, Jan. 21 at 10 a.m., Pacific time.

The old format is popular with spectators because they can watch all the bowlers in action at the same time during the match play. In the head-to-head format, half the field is eliminated after each round.

Southern California bowlers are encouraged to support the Dick Weber Open, either with their attendance or by participating in the Saturday Pro-Am. Dave Osborn will appreciate it—and if enough bowlers and spectators turn out, it might convince him to host the 3rd annual Dick Weber Open in 2008.

Following the Fountain Bowl stop, the pros head for the Denny's Motel 6 Classic, Jan. 24-28, at the Strike Zone at Sunset Station, located in the Las Vegas suburb of Henderson. It will mark the PBA's first return to Sin City after an absence of several years.

Remember the good old days when the world-famous Showboat Bowling Center hosted the pros for more than 30 years? Many memorable tournaments were held at the venerable 106-lane establishment. The Strike Zone hopes to create the same kind of excitement.

Speaking of exciting tournaments, there was plenty of it at the 14th annual WWPB (Western Women Pro Bowlers) Mixed Doubles Nov. 18-19 at Bill Mossontte's Mission Hills (Calif.) Bowl.

Most of the excitement was provided by the team of Leanne

Barrette and Ben Laughlin. Not only did they win the \$2,200 title—they went wire-to-wire and won by a whopping 397 pins—but they each shot a 300 in the fifth game of the first qualifying block.

That's right...a 600 total that, according to Mossontte, equaled a USBC record. "As a matter of fact, it's only the second time it's ever been done," he said.

Asked if he would reward Barrette and Laughlin with the traditional \$100 for a perfect game, Mossontte replied, "Maybe I'll give them \$150 each...or even \$200 for tying the USBC record."

Laughlin, a touring pro from Maricopa, Ariz., went on to fire a second 300. Others shooting 300s were Chris Glossner and Joel Reyes, who also had a 299 game.

Finishing second in the tournament were 3-time defending champs Wendy Macpherson and Dave Wodka, who shared \$1,700.

Barrette and Macpherson were two of five former PWBA champions competing at Mission Hills. The others were Kim Terrell—Barrette's closest friend who was married on Oct. 7—Tennelle Milligan and Dede Davidson.

Terrell bowled with Gary Hulsenberg, who is Barrette's fiancé. They plan to tie the knot on July 1.

So how come Barrette and Hulsenberg didn't bowl together in the tournament? They had hoped to, but wound up with different partners because of a last-minute mixup.

"Ben and I had other partners (Tim Brown Jr. and Shannon Pluhowsky)," Barrette explained, "but they weren't able to bowl, so Ben and I got put together. It turned out great.

"Tim and Shannon may not get their partners back," Barrette said with a smile.

Laughlin also said he wanted "to thank Tim and Shannon for dropping us as partners at the last minute."

As the Great Bard wrote, "All's well that ends well."

NOTES TO YOU: The Los Angeles Times announced recently that Station Casinos Inc., which features several bowling centers in their Las Vegas-based hotels, has agreed to a \$4.7-billion buyout offer from its founding family, the Fertitta's, and an affiliate of Colony Capital. Approving the deal were Chief Executive Frank Fertitta and President Lorenzo Fertitta, who are expected to remain at Station Casinos Inc. In fact, no major personnel changes are planned...

From Yahoo News on the Internet, a recent news release stated

that Esther Medley of Centralia, Wash., who is 94 and legally blind, rolled a 244 game. Medley's 86-year-old husband, Ralph, lines her up on the lanes and tells her which pins are left standing after her first ball. Medley had eight strikes in the 244 she rolled in a senior league at Fairway Lanes in Centralia. The Medleys have been bowling in the league since 1979...

And talking about senior bowlers, Frank Kietz, the longtime historian and columnist for the California Bowling News, was to be feted at his 90th birthday party on Saturday, Dec. 16 at Forest Lanes in the south Orange County community of Lake Forest. Actually, Frank's birthday is on Dec. 23, but it's so close to Christmas that family members opted to hold the party one week earlier. A large crowd was expected to attend...Kietz, in spite of his years, is still very active. The former president of the Bowling Writers Assn. of America continues to write about the sport he loves, he bowls several times a week, and he's very popular in senior social circles. That means he has a lot of blue-haired ladies chasing after him...

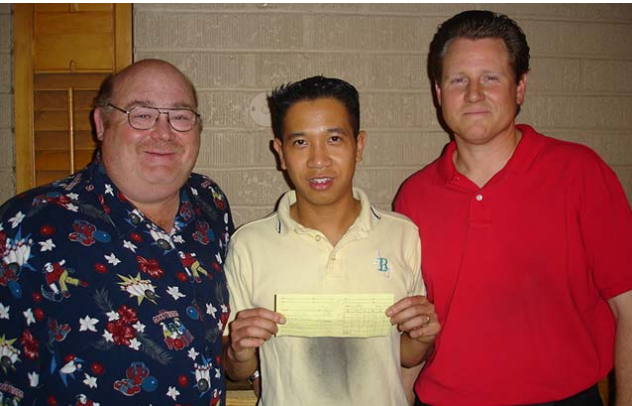



National Deaf Bowling News

by Connie Marchione
Thanks to many writers and friends who emailed and even mailed their congratulations to me for my election to USBC Hall of Fame. I still can not believe it and thanks to a great writer Joe Lyou for his TenPin Slants column about me.

I did not even know I was nominated and it was not easy getting in it. For these who want to know something about this USBC Hall of Fame, I am writing a small primer on it.

THE USBC HALL OF FAME, it's history, requirements and election. Since ABC and WIBC merged into USBC, USBC took over both ABC and WIBC Halls of Fame and changed to one USBC Hall of Fame honoring both men and women bowlers.

It may surprise you that ABC Hall of Fame is founded in 1941 as the third oldest Hall of Fame shrine in US after baseball (1936) and golf (1940). In 1941 eleven men entered in the Hall of Fame in the first induction ceremonies.

The USBC Hall of Fame is governed by a Board of Directors made up by representatives of the Hall, USBC and the Bowling Writers Association of America. The Hall has committees that meet annually - Veterans, Meritorious Service and Ballot. The Meritorious Service committee studies the records of nominees who had national impact. The committee elects those people with 70% required for election.

The Ballot committee studies the records of current bowlers and forwards those who qualifies to either the regular or non-pro national ballot. The first requirement is 20 years participation in the USBC Championships Tournament.

To be elected the bowler must receive 70% of the votes cast.

A second ballot among the highest three votegetters can be held with specific requirements to be elected.

A special Pioneer committee was formed in 1990 to elect people who were at the foundation of bowling history including some who excelled before the beginning of ABC in 1895.

For the past several years as a long time member of Bowling Writers Association of America, I was on as the ABC regular and non-pro national ballot voter. It stopped when USBC took over but now I am back on the voting list, having voted recently.

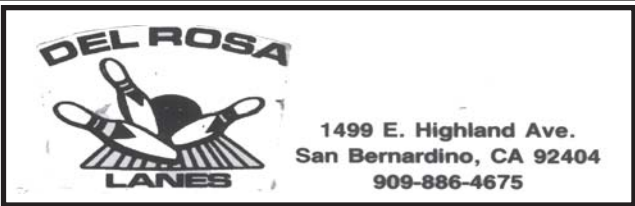
