LA HABRA—This week-end, December 17-18 is the scheduled dates for the final WCST Ebonite Singles Tournament of the year at La Habra “300” Bowl in La Habra, CA. This will be a fun filled and a very competitive week-end, as a full house of 80 WCST Members only, that had bowled in at least 4 WCST tournaments this year are expected to compete for a prize fund of \$12,585.00, which includes the \$2500.00 added from sales of Ebonite International Bowling Balls that were sold at the tournament sites we attended this year.

All bowlers entered compete for the regular prize fund finals, with super seniors with high enough qualifying scores may cross over into the regular finals. Allen Adds Another One

MECHANICSBURG—The defending PBA Player of the Year Patrick Allen earned his sixth career Denny’s PBA Tour title with a 247-218 win over PBA Hall of Famer Tom Baker in the title match of the 2005 Keystone State Championship Sunday at ABC West Lanes.

Allen jumped out to an early lead using an Ebonite The One, striking on his first five shots while Baker was forced to convert three spares over the same span.

“I wanted to get out as fast as I could, and fortunately I kept the clamp down,” said Allen, who won \$40,000. “That match could have gone the other way if I didn’t carry those strikes.”

Baker, 51-years-old from King, N.C., tried to put pressure on Allen with strikes in the 7th and 8th frames, but the left-hander matched him both times.

Allen (Tarrytown, N.Y.) defeated Mika Koivuniemi, 226-200, in the semifinals to advance to his 10th career title match in 15 championship round appearances. With the match tied through four frames, Koivuniemi failed to strike in frames 5-9 and opened twice, while Allen had two strikes and three spares.

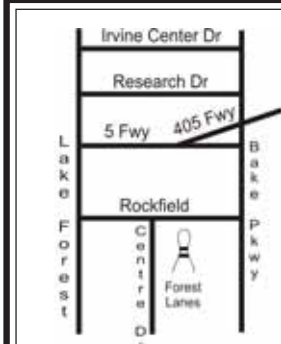

Dick Weber Open

FOUNTAIN VALLEY—Fountain Bowl in Fountain Valley, Calif., has hosted many special Denny’s Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Tour events in the past, but none will be as memorable as the 2006 Dick Weber Open. The unique event, which takes place Jan. 10-15, 2006, will pay tribute to the PBA Hall of Famer and 26-time Tour title winner who passed away Feb. 14, 2005.

The 2006 Dick Weber Open is one of just two Denny’s PBA Tour events to be held on the west coast this season, and it’s the only one in the west open to both PBA members and amateurs. The format for the event will take on a “throwback” feel, with participants bowling 15 games of qualifying over three five-game sessions, after which the top 24 advance to round robin match play.

“[Dick Weber’s] achievements on the lanes are equaled and surpassed only by his legacy off the lanes. He was a great competitor and champion, and he was an outstanding ambassador for our sport,” PBA Commissioner and CEO Fred Schreyer said of Weber. “More importantly, Dick was a truly good, compassionate person who treated everyone like family.”

The event begins with the official PBA Practice Session and PBA Pro-Ams taking place Tuesday, Jan. 10. On Wednesday, Jan. 11, the entire field will bowl two five-game qualifying sessions before bowling a third five-game block on Thursday, Jan. 12. After 15 games, the top 24 qualifiers will advance to round robin match play Thursday evening.

Friday, Jan. 13 will feature two additional round robin match play sessions, after which the top four bowlers will advance to the championship round. Saturday, Jan. 14 is a day for the fans with official PBA Pro-Am sessions taking place

throughout the day.

The ESPN live televised finals will take place Sunday, Jan. 15 at 10 a.m. PST and feature a step-ladder finals format. Bowlers will be vying for a piece of the \$150,000 prize fund (based on 160 entries) and an exemption for the 2006-07 Denny’s PBA Tour season.

Bowlers looking to enter the 2006 Dick Weber Open can do so by visiting the PBA’s official website, www.pba.com, and clicking on the “Enter Tournament” button at the top of the homepage. PBA members can also use the entry form found in the bi-monthly PBA Newsletter, and both members and non-members can contact the PBA’s main office at (206) 332-9688.

It’s only fitting the Tour is holding an event in Dick Weber’s honor. Weber, born Dec. 23, 1929, was a PBA Charter Member and enjoyed a storied career, capturing 26 Denny’s PBA Tour titles and six PBA Senior Tour titles. He was elected to the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Hall of Fame in 1970 and was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 1975.

In addition, Weber won the BPAA All-Star (The U.S. Open’s predecessor) on four occasions, was named the Bowler of the Year three times (1961, ’63 and ’65) and won the PBA Player of the Year Award in 1965. He also is the only bowler in history to win a PBA title in five different decades.

The world’s best bowlers will be on hand to bowl and pay tribute to Dick Weber, including his son Pete. He recently snapped a 26-event winless streak when he won his 32nd career Tour title in the 2005 BowlersParadise.com Classic. The win added to his overwhelming list of titles and accolades, but a victory in the event dedicated to his father’s memory would trump any of his previous accomplishments.

Gage Bowl's Harvey Hemmingsen Remembers His Bowling Years

NORWALK — Harvey Hemmingsen will be 99 years old on July 19, 2007. He was born in 1907 in North Dakota (no post office, market or town at that time). When a teen, his family moved to Eugene, Oregon where he got his first taste of the bowling game by getting a job as a pin setter, but he did not bowl then.

He attended high school for 1 1/2 years, quit school and went to work as a painter, painting cars and houses for \$10 per week. He did this until 1927 when he moved to San Francisco, California. He took up interior decorating but did not pursue this career. He moved from San Francisco to Los Angeles with a buddy, called a painter friend, and obtained a job painting houses in the area of Central and Manchester Avenues. He married in 1935 but his wife passed away. An opening for painting cars became available with Hal Roach & Jimmy Dickens Chevrotlet Dealership, and he worked there for two years.

In 1942, he went to work for Northrup Aircraft during World War II and retired in 1972 after 30 years. Harvey married the love of his life in 1970, and lost her to cancer after 20 years of a wonderful marriage.

It was while working at Northrup that he began bowling. He bowled at Missile Bowl in Gardena and with his team earned a multitude of first place trophies. To be on this team, you had to maintain an average of 179 or higher. He not only bowled at Missile, but at other lanes in the area. In the mid-70's, he and his team were asked to bowl at another house because they kept taking first place and other teams voted that Harvey's team leave so they would have a chance. He and his teammates started attending Arena, Century, Trianon and Gage Bowls. In the 80's, he teamed up with another senior member (Tex Barker, 92) and limited their bowling to two houses, the Trianon and Gage. After Trianon closed, they made Gage Bowl their home and have won several first place championships. Currently carrying a 141 average.

Harvey says he has a house full of trophies and is proud that he has achieved them in the sport he loves. He is a widower and lives alone, still drives a car, and is very spry for a man his age. He was not asked what attributed to his longevity, but it is felt that he lived well and continues to do so.

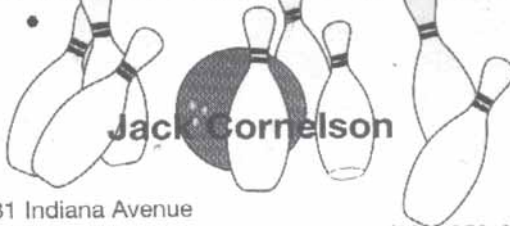

“Bud” Fisher Remembered

INDIANAPOLIS—E. A. “Bud” Fisher, long-time PR Director for the Professional Bowlers’ Association passed away on December 9th in Indianapolis at the age of 83.

Fisher has been living in Indianapolis since 1989, the year he retired from the PBA, after 30 years of service. He was the first employee hired by the late Eddie Elias and, along with Joe Antenora and Harry Golden, was one of the four men who brought the PBA into prominence from the 1960’s through the 1980’s.

Fisher brought a wealth of experience in sports publicity and promotion to the then-young PBA. He had a background in newspaper writing (Akron Beacon Journal) as a sports and police reporter; auto racing, horse racing, unlimited hydroplanes, National Industrial Basketball League publicity bureau founder, boxing and wrestling, and professional football.

Fisher inherited the job, not only as PR Director, but assisted nearly 850 local sponsors in organizing their tournaments in such spots a Puerto Rico, Caracas, Venezuela, Tokyo, Japan, London, England, Paris, France, and altogether logged some six million air miles during his 30 years with the PBA. Fisher also accompanied network television crews in their surveys of host bowling centers.

Following his retirement, Fisher worked part-time with Dick Evans on the PBA Senior Tour, for Team USA (Jerry Koenig) and covered FIQ and World Cup Tournaments in virtually every corner of the world.

Along with Chuck Pezzano, Fisher helped to organize PBA television tours on Home Box Office, ESPN, NBC, and CBS.

After moving to Indianapolis, Fisher continued part-time publicity, including 17 BPAA tournaments, publicity for the Central Indiana Bowling Centers Association (CIBCA), and publicity for the local PBA tournament hosted each year by the CIBCA and Royal Pin Leisure Centers.

Fisher won numerous awards during his tenure in sports. In his home town of Akron, Ohio Fisher became a member of the Summit County Sports Hall of Fame, the Akron Radio Hall of Fame, and the PBA Hall of Fame. He received the BWAA Mort Luby Distinguished Service Award, and is one of three Americans to win the World Bowling Writer’s Golden Quille Award. Fisher received the first BPAA Excellence in Media Award. He is also a nominee for Bowling’s Hall of Fame. Fisher was a Purple Heart veteran of WW II and will be interred at Arlington National Cemetery. Don Ketter Hits 765 In Olathe League

OLATHE... Word was received that Don Ketter, the former 1997 Deaf Team USA member and coach of the victorious 2001 Italy Deaflympics Deaf Team USA which swept all the men’s bowling gold medals is getting better day by day. A year after that he was stricken by some kind of inflamed ailment, which made him stop weekly bowling until last year he came back slowly this season.

In late 2000 Ketter bowled on the Flying Hands deaf team that scored a deaf team record 3305 series in a Olathe league. He thought his team was the first deaf team to break the 3300 barrier, only to find that St Louis deaf five men hit a 3302 earlier in the year. Then as the coach he watched his Deaf Team USA broke his Flying Fingers team record when they rolled a Deaflympics record first 3 games 3326 at Italy. This record was broken last April by Fast N’ Furious team from Detroit which scored 3334 in the Great Lakes Deaf Tournament at Merrillville, Ind.

As reported last September Ketter started off this season very well. Then last November 28 in his Olathe Automotive League he rolled 226-278-182 for 686. One can guess he did not like the way he finished in his 3rd game.

The following week in the same league Ketter finished better, rolling a 765 series from games of 221-267-277. That is his highest series in past 4 years. Prior to 2001 he had better series of 781 at AMF College Lanes in Overland Park, 777 at Olathe West Lanes and 776 at Olathe East Lanes.

His 765 pulled his average up to 214, currently 4th in his league and the top guy has 219. Ketter aims to finish at the top at the end of season. Let us hear from him when he does.

NO 800 BUT BOB JONES 785 LED DEAF TRAVEL AT AMF BOWLING SQUARE

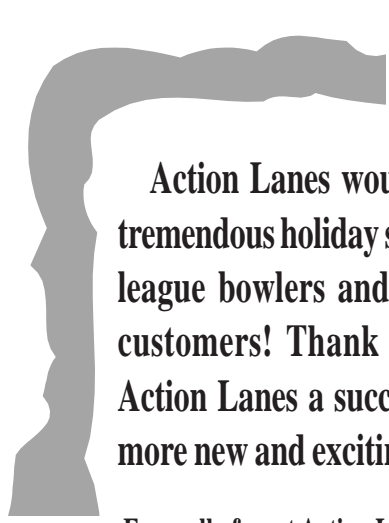
