Underdog Smallwood Wins One for America's Unemployed in PBA World Championship

WICHITA, KS—Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Mich., hit a home run for America's unemployed workers Sunday, upsetting reigning Professional Bowlers Association Player of the Year Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, 244-228, to win the PBA World Championship at Northrock Lanes.

Smallwood, a 32-year-old former assembly line worker who was laid off from his job with General Motors nearly a year ago, won his first PBA Tour title, his first "major" title, a \$50,000 first prize, a two-year exemption to continue his PBA Tour career and his first chance to bowl in January's PBA Tournament of Champions.

The title match was a nail-biter until the 10th frame. Malott started with four strikes, but then ran into carry problems on the right lane. Smallwood stayed close, striking on five of his first six shots, but then left a 4-6-7 split in the seventh frame and the tide turned to Malott's favor. Malott wasn't able to put two strikes together in the final frames, however, and Smallwood answered with another four strikes in a row – including two in the tense-filled 10th frame – to seal the victory.

"It's surreal," Smallwood

said. "It has been a wild ride."

"I was already so nervous in the 10th frame, I told myself I couldn't possibly get any more nervous," he added. "The right lane was my good lane anyway, so I figured if I threw a decent shot, I'd be OK."

Smallwood said he always felt he could compete on the PBA Tour, but with a wife and two-year-old daughter, he had no desire to go on the road until he got the bad news from General Motors. He then decided to enter the PBA Tour Trials in suburban Detroit, where a finish in the top eight meant a full year's exemption to bowl. Finishing third meant a new career option.

"I wouldn't be here otherwise," he said. "Getting an exemption is so hard to do."

Ironically, Smallwood recently got a call from the General Motors jobs bank, offering him a chance to go back to work.

"The lady who called asked me if I wanted to come back to work, but I told her no," he said. "She asked what I was doing. I told her I'm now a professional bowler and that I'd be on ESPN this weekend. At first she didn't believe me, but the lady sitting next to her was a bowler, so I wound up talking to her for a while. Now

I think the people at GM are fans."

"It's disappointing, but I couldn't get my ball to read the left lane," Malott said. "I made the adjustments I needed to make, committed to them and threw good shots, so there really wasn't much more I could have done. Tom stepped up in the 10th frame and made the shots he needed to make, so my congratulations to him."

Malott defeated Rhino Page of Wesley Chapel, Fla., in the first semifinal round

match, 203-191. Malott started the match with four strikes, but gave Page a chance when he left the 2-4-8-10 split in the fifth frame and opened, followed by missing a 10 pin. But Page made a fatal error, leaving the 4-6-10 split in his ninth frame, and Malott closed the door with a spare/strike in his 10th frame.

Smallwood, who had lost resoundingly in his first TV appearance earlier in the season, threw a pair of turkeys at continued on page 15

The pool numbers started a 400 and went to 700. One night in the Monday scratch league when the pool had gotten up to over \$200 we had a scratch bowler, the third game of league, start with the first 11 strikes on 7 and 8.

Now remember this was when a 300 was a pretty big deal. I looked down to 7 and 8 and saw a couple bowlers standing and watching for the last shot. I looked down to 21 and 22, where Danny was bowling, and saw 30 or 40 people watching Danny throw his last shot for the night.

Well the guy shot 300 and there was barely any clapping. Danny got a 4 count on his last ball of the night of a 468 series and the place went wild.

Final WCST Ebonite Singles For 2009 Won By Eric Forkel Senior Division, Kevin Gannon Wins Super Senior Title

LAUGHLIN—The year 2009, ended on a high note, for Eric Forkel (Henderson, NV), as he captured his 5th Title this year. This one a lot closer at the end of the finals, then a couple of games earlier. Eric grabbed a slim lead over qualifying leader, Doug Talsma, after game 3 of the 8 man finals, and a 145 pin lead over the eventual 2nd place finisher Joe Merrill.

Up by 91 pins over Joe, going into the position round. The two finalists were matching strike for strike, until Joe, got the upper hand to beat Eric 279 to 259, and with the bonus pins of 30, managed only to pick up 50 pins , to lose to Eric by 41 pins. The added money of \$2000.00 to the tournament , was pro-rated for each division., the senior division, got \$700.00 for their 24 entries, with 8 places being paid out for a total of \$4,070.00, and a total for the year of \$155,320.00 in pay-offs for both divisions. The over-all total paid out for 298 Tournaments is \$3,475.881.00. Mike Clemence a 300 game in the qualifying

Kevin Gannon (Lakewood), captured his 5th Title for the year 2009, in the Super Senior Division, and a grand total now of 31 Titles, tying, Vaughn Doody for the most WCST Championships. By winning this one, and the big \$1200.00 1st place prize, Kevin the WCST Life-Time Money Leader, has now won over \$90,000.00.

The Super Seniors received \$1300.00 in added money for this tournament. 56 entries, the highest amount of super seniors entered in any single tournament, competed at a very high scoring pace, with Ron Gales rolling a 300 game in the qualifying, and Darwin Wimer, and Kevin bowling 300 games in the finals.

With only a 2 pin lead after game 8 of the 14 matches, Kevin started to pull away from the field, and won this tournament by 89 pins over 2nd place finisher, Bernie Iwasczyszyn. The biggest move of the finals, Ron Winger, losing his 1st 8 matches, rolling 1662, then for his final 6 games bowled 1474, and won 5 of 6 games, to finish 7th.
