closed to within two pins after five frames, Ciminelli threw another string of five strikes to race away with his first title since winning the 2011 Earl Anthony Memorial.

Inspired Ciminelli Wins PBA Chameleon Championship

"It was tough to put (the Viper) behind me, but I decided to use it as inspiration instead of letting it get to me," the 27year-old left-hander said. "I felt really good. I broke the lane down the way I wanted to and created some room for myself.

"I knew the (right) side really wasn't that good," he continued. "I knew if I stayed within myself, 220, 230 would probably win.

"The second title feels better (than the first)," Ciminelli added. "It's been too long. You know you can win after the first one, but you wait three years and you begin to ask yourself if you're a one-hit wonder. So now that's off my shoulders.

Barrett, who was the top qualifier for the Chameleon stepladder finals, was a bit confused at the start of the

"I didn't feel like I made many bad shots, but my ball

reaction didn't look very good," Barrett said. "One time it would hook, the next time it would go straight. It's not the kind of scenario you want going into a title match against someone who was throwing the ball as well as Ryan was.'

Barrett insisted the blue oil had no bearing on anything, Ciminelli's sentiechoing ments.

"I think when you get to a certain level, your ball is your guide," he said of the colored oil. "You've grown up reading ball reaction. That's how we make our decisions. That's how we win tournaments, so any visual aid out there might be great for TV or young bowlers, but when you get to this level, it doesn't matter. We're going to use information available to us like pattern length, the type of oil, the lane surface. All of those things make a huge difference, but visually, we're going to read ball motions. We know what we do.

"If you paid too much attention to (the blue oil), you'd

This guy swaggers up to me and says, "Bowling is a stupid game.'

"Oh yeah." said I.

"Oh yeah." said he.

"Why?" said I.

"I'll tell you why." said he.

And with all the nice stuff out of the way his mouth was off and running.

Two bowlers are working on a strike. The first rolls a gutter ball or gets two or three off on his next ball. The other bowler throws what looks like a perfect ball, but the 10 pin doesn't go down. If they both make their spares, the score is exactly the same even though the first bowler's performance can hardly compare with the effort of the second."

I told him, "You're all wrong. Things aren't what they seem to be. It all evens out in the end. If a bowler keeps rolling bad balls on strikes he'll leave tough spares and will miss many of them. And if you keep the ball in the pocket you'll get more than your share of strikes. It's like the baseball player who hits line drives right at an opposing player. Sooner or later, they're going to fall for hits.'

I thought I slowed him down a bit but he came right back, saying, "And you bowling writers, always talking about how many pins a bowler knocks down. You never get it right."

This attack raised my ire and in defense of all the overworked and underpaid bowling writers in this world (all three of them) I meanly asked, "And what do you mean

He quickly countered my question with his own. "How many pins does a bowler actually knock down when he rolls a 300 game?" I quickly figured 12 strikes times 10 pins equals 120 and told him so.

He smiled. "So the most pins you can actually knock down in a game is 120. Yet, one bowler can knock down 120 pins and score a 300 game while another can knock down 120 pins by recording nine spares and a triple in the last frame, and all he can shoot is 202 at best."

He was wound up now and kept going. "When a bowler finishes with a 650 series you writers often say he knocked down 650 stricks, had total pinfall of 650 or some other phrase that adds up to the same thing, that a bowler knocked down 650 pins. He never did. He may have knocked down only 270 pins and scored a 650 series. So why don't you bowling people wise up and say a bowler scored 300 points or 650 points instead of saying he knocked down 300 or 650."

He pushed on. "Who devised this system of bowling scoring?" Has anyone in bowling ever analyzed what I'm saying and thougt about changes?"

My adversary was getting to me and whether he had a point or not, he was stabbing pretty good. I weakly defended our position on scoring, telling him that it was such a basic standard that changes in scoring would create havoc and added that it had stood the test of time just fine until he opened up. I had little defense in regard to pinfall and reluctantly agreed that maybe we should say points instead

I finally had to resort to my "get you off the hook" phrase. Whenever a sportswriter friend of mine receives a nasty or critical letter he jots off a note to the sender, saying, "Maybe you're right." That's what I told this critic.

He went away happy and left me in a quandry. The thing that really got me was the simple fact I hadn't thought of some of his criticism long before he brought it up.

It would have made a heck of a column.

SHORT SHOTS

*** If you ever feel that you know all the answers to the wide world of bowling, stop kidding yourself. It would only be because you haven't heard all the questions.

*** You often hear about an untimely split popping up. I don't ever recall anyone running into a timely split.

** An older league bowler won the admiration of all the other bowlers in his league when he went back to school to study languages and through great sacrifice in time and money, obtained an advanced degree. He felt those 10 vears of night school were well worth it when the was the only team captain able to put his team's lineup down in Latin. And he continued to feel great about the whole thing until that fateful day when he walked into his bowling center, and on one set of lanes a doctor's league was bowling, right next to the priest's league.



Though bowling seems to be essentially the same, there are constant changes in equipment, both personal and in the bowling center. In fact, if you stay away from bowling 20 years or so, the only thing you'd recognize when you came back would be the excuses.

be ignoring the facts of what you've been doing all week. Ball motion is far more important."

Ciminelli, the No. 3 qualifier coming into the Chameleon finals, ran away from Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Mich., in the first match, 255-197, and was equally impressive in eliminating Brian Kretzer of Dayton, Ohio, 235-179, in the semifinal match.

The Chameleon telecast also included the third of four special PBA League Challenge segments in which the eight PBA League franchise players are demonstrating their skills in unique competitions. In the "Obstacle Bowling" round, players tried to knock down as many pins as they could by throwing three shots through or around an obstacle course of rubber pins positioned at intervals down the lane.

BROOKLYN STyLES franchise player Sean Rash won the competition in a one-ball roll-off against Pittsburgh Jack Rabbits' franchise player Osku Palermaa after they tied at 28 out of a possible total of 30.

"The obstacle course was fun," Rash said. "I'm pretty good at throwing it hard and straight off the corner, and hooking it as much as possible. You were just trying to hit a target, draw a line and throw it hard, and I was able to come out on top in that one."

"Visually (obstacle bowling) isn't much different than what we do," added Chris Barnes, who represented the Silver Lake Atom Splitters and tied for second with a 27. "There is always (an invisible) sand trap or a tree that you have to avoid, but physically you can't see them represented like (the rubber pins)."

Next Sunday's Scorpion Championship finals include top qualifier Marshall Kent of Yakima, Wash., an amateur and a Collegiate All-American at Robert Morris University-Illinois who was invited to bowl in the World Series on a PBA Commissioner's Exemption; Smallwood; Josh Blanchard of Gilbert, Ariz., and Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, S.C. The telecast also will include a PBA League "TO" Challenge in which NFL all-pro wide receiver and PBA League Dallas Strikers owner Terrell Owens will make a shot and a randomly-selected player will try to exactly match TO's pinfall.

A post-finals look at the Chameleon Championship and a preview of the Scorpion Championship, along with other features, will be available Monday on "The Bowling Center" on YouTube. com. Xtra Frame subscribers who may have missed Sunday's telecasts will be able to watch the finals "on demand" in the Xtra Frame archives three days after the original show airs.






