## liz Johnson Wins Chameleon Championshhip, Becomes Second Woman to Win PBA Tour Title England's Richie Teece wins PBA Shark Championship for first PBA Tour title

RENO, Nev. - Liz Johnson of Palatine, Ill., became the second woman in the 60 -year history of the Professional Bowlers Association to win a national tour title when she defeated Anthony Pepe of Elmhurst, N.Y., 220-206, in the title match of the PBA Chameleon Championship presented by Reno Tahoe at the National Bowling Stadium.

The Chameleon Championship, one of four PBA animal pattern championships conducted during the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling IX presented by Eldorado Resorts Reno Properties, aired Sunday on ESPN along with the finals of the PBA Shark Championship presented by Xtra Frame, which was won by England's Richie Teece. The back-to-back telecasts were part of the 2017-18 Go Bowling! PBA Tour package.

But flying Dutchman Xander van Mazijk did more. Not only reaching the final with great performance during the qualifications? with games 246-220-214-242-224-227 avg. 225.12

He did more than that he won the title! GOLD MEDAL. Never before a Dutchman reached a final of the world championship in the Single Event.

The final match against opponent WU HAO MING from Chinese Taipei was a clash of two different styles. WU HAO MING using the typical so-called spinner or helicopter style had the rest of the players shown having no problems with the difficult Bejing pattern.

WU HAO MING was the only player who scored a perfect game 300 in the qualifications.

In the finals, the Dutchman stayed cool and defeated him with 224 against 190. Xander van Mazijk started to bowl seriously after a school bowling party when he was at the age of 7 years. He enjoined the game, became a member of a club, and so started his bowling career. In daily life Van Mazijk works, on a 40 hours week contract, as a lightning protection engineer, in the industrial area of the Port of Rotterdam. He spends all his spare time on the bowling alley as much as possible practically training every day. Almost every weekend he is playing tournaments also abroad in other countries and competitions to improve his level. You cannot compare it with the way PBA players are able to practice and play in tournaments for a living

At his return VAN THE MAN was welcomed by thousands of enthusiastic fans at Schiphol Airport Amsterdam. Immediately interviewed by 5 or 6 TV channels. A great experience and for all a great promotion for the bowling sport in The Netherlands.

A unique achievement from a bowler of a country where bowling is known as a small sport with a maximum of 10.000 registered members and no major sponsors available to support talented bowlers. So for many amateur bowlers I would say.. enjoy your games.. there is still hope.

Maybe once in time you also become a world champion.... you never know... keep on going.

The 2018 PBA Tour Finals field will be based on total earnings for 2016, 2017 and early 2018, concluding with the PBA Xtra Frame Maine Shootout April 17-18 at Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine. Other events from late 2017 and early 2018 that will impact the earnings list include all GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling IX events, the DHC PBA Japan Invitational, PBA Tournament of Champions, Go Bowling! PBA 60th Anniversary Classic, Barbasol PBA Players Championship, Mark Roth/Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship presented by BowlerX, USBC Masters and the Xtra Frame PBA Maine Shootout.

Details regarding the PBA Tour Finals format will be announced. At stake will be a $\$ 30,000$ first prize and a PBA Tour title The Finals will be taped for television by CBS Sports Network. Telecast dates and times will be announced later. The 10 hours of nationally-televised coverage will conclude the Go Bowling! PBA Tour series which began with the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling IX, presented by Eldorado Resorts Reno Properties, in Dec.

PBAAnnounces 14-vvent2018PBB5OTour Season


CHICAGO - The Professional Bowlers Association has announced a 14-event PBA50 Tour schedule for 2018 that includes four major championships and three new venues.

In what is becoming the traditional opening event for PBA's tour for players 50 and over, Lane Glo Bowl in New Port Richey, Fla. will once again kick off the season with the PBA50 Florida Open April 21-23 which will be followed by the season's first major, the PBA50 National Championship presented by Spanish Springs Lanes and Radical April 24-28 in The Villages, Fla.

Las Vegas will once again be home for two of the PBA50 Tour's most prestigious majors. The USBC Senior Masters will be held at Sam's Town in Las Vegas June 4-10, followed by the Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open presented by Storm at the Suncoast Bowling Center June 10-15.

New to the schedule in 2018 will be first-time stops in Monticello, Minn., for the PBA50 River City Extreme Open presented by Ebonite at River City Extreme July 17-20, the PBA50 Security Federal Savings Bank Championship presented by Track at Dave Small's Heritage Lanes in Kokomo, Ind., July 28-31, and the PBA50 Cup presented by DV8, the season's fourth major, at Spectrum Lanes in Wyoming, Mich., Aug. 9-12.

Returning to the schedule for 2018 will be stops in Mooresville, N.C., April 29-May 2; Farmingdale, N.Y., May 5-8; Brentwood, Calif., May 27-30 and three other stops in Indiana (Hammond, July 23-26; Anderson, Aug. 4-7 and Fort Wayne, Aug. 14-16).

The season will also include two PBA60 tournaments for players 60 and over; the USBC Super Senior Classic at Sam's Town May 31-June 3 and the PBA60 Dick Weber Championship presented by 900 Global at Pro Bowl West which closes out the season in Fort Wayne, Aug. 14-16.

Liz Johnson, talking openly for the first time about being gay after winning the PBA Chameleon Championship: "I started bowling on the ladies tour when I was 20 or 21 and a good portion of the ladies out there were gay. Anyone who was out there knew who anyone was and it didn't matter. They didn't care who you were with. The guys have always treated me well because of my ability and my personality. If you're a great person, you're a great person. Same thing with the guys. They don't care who I'm with. Everyone respects one another."
 Joe Novara, who bowled a 900 series and lives in Patchogue, N.Y.: "I might hate snow more than 10 pins.

Tom Martino, who survived a harrowing car accident in which his auto was slammed into a free fall on the Hollywood
 Freeway before it stopped on the diamond lane facing oncoming traffic: "I was driving on the freeway one moment and the next moment I'm fighting for my life.

Jeff Stitz, who calmly threw three pocket strikes in the $10^{\text {th }}$ frame to notch his first perfect game: "Actually, my feet felt like jello and I was just hoping I didn't fall fat on my face.

Jillian Wiseman, who sports a 110 average and claimed the title with partner Nicholas Huang in a Corbin Bowl no-tap doubles handicap tournament: "It was shock and awe. It will never happen again."

Carol Mancini, the editor/publisher of the California Bowling News who's witnessed five weddings at bowling centers: "I've never seen one that ever lasted."
Tom Martino got into a horrible car crash but lived to tell about

"This is the cherry on top of my career," the 43 -year old Buffalo, N.Y., area native said. "This win is for all of the young girls in any sport, not just bowling, who have to compete against the guys. This is for you."
"I never thought I'd have the opportunity again," Johnson said. "You never know, bowling against the guys. Conditions haven't been very conducive to my 'A' game the past couple of years, but I felt pretty confident coming into the show."
"I don't think I've ever been intimidated, in my entire life, or scared of anyone on the lanes," she continued. "I grew up bowling against the guys since I was 10 or 11. I've been beating them since I was 17, so I didn't feel like I had anything to prove. I didn't have anything to lose, so I just went out to do my best, and that's all I can ask of myself."
Johnson advanced to the title match by bowling the highest score in a preliminary four-player shootout match where the two highest scores moved on. Johnson had a 257 game and Pepe a 255 while Wes Malott of Pflugerville Texas (248) and Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Mich. (236), were eliminated.
To reach the Chameleon Championship telecast Johnson out-bowled a WSOB IX field of 195 bowlers from round the world
In the second telecast of the ESPN doubleheader, Teece won the Shark Championship with a 193-176 victory ove Charlie Brown Jr. of Grandville, Mich., in a battle of firsttime PBA Tour television finalists. Teece put the title away with back-to-back strikes in the ninth and 10 frames for his only double of the contest.
Brown earned his berth in the championship match with a 227 in the preliminary shootout. Teece was second with a 209 , eliminating Tom Daugherty of Riverview, Fla. (197) and Marshall Kent of Yakima, Wash. (193).
"It's incredible," Teece said. "It's been a dream of mine ever since I started watching old VHS tapes of the PBA when I was 10 years old. I really, really give credit to the guys who won, and now I've joined that circle.

Teece made his decision to come to bowl in PBA competition more by necessity than choice
"I was a web developer for three years after college, but the company I worked for ran out of projects for me. I was pretty sad about it, but the money they gave me (as a severance package) made me think about it. Joining the PBA was something I'd always dreamed about. I was young and three or four years later, here I am."
In winning his first PBA Tour title, Teece joined the ranks of the handful of players who have won a PBA title in their first television appearance. Canada's Graham Fach was the most recent to accomplish that feat when he won the 2016 Barbasol PBA Players Championship.

## Popular PBA50 Tour Player Bill McCorkle Dies at 65

CHICAGO - Bill McCorkle, a PBA60 national tournament, four-time regional and three-time PBA50 regional titlist from Westerville, Ohio, died Thursday after a battle with cancer. He was 65

One of the most popular players on the PBA50 Tour, McCorkle achieved his dream of winning a PBA national title by capturing the 2014 PBA60 Dick Weber Super Senior Classic title in Fort Wayne, Ind., when he defeated PBA Hall of Famer Johnny Petraglia, 244-173, in the title match at Pro Bowl West.

McCorkle's win in that event was made extra special when his close friend since childhood - fellow Westerville, Ohio native Bill Henson - won the same event the very next year, also beating Petraglia for the title under very similar circumstances.
