While gathered in the lobby, I immediately recognized a familiar face behind the Information Desk, a woman Volunteer. I was pleased that she recognized me as well. Marianne said that "Lee" and her husband's service as Volunteers at this facility, dated as far back as the 1980's. When her husband passed away, "Lee" continued her faithful service. And, what a joy she is to the veterans and visitors. She's pleasant; she's patient; and she's articulate with her information or directions. They get an A+ for her.

Directly off the Lobby is the newly refurbished Ambulatory Care Center. It is beautiful. The Waiting Room is large with plenty of seating and reading materials. The atrium ceiling is gorgeous, bringing into the room that natural feeling of the outdoor. This area is laid out in such a way that if the patient need to have blood drawn, it's right there. If that visit determines they need the advise of a Dietician, it's right there. If there's need for the patient to see a Dermatologist; Psychoanalyst; you name it, it's NOW all centralized in this area.

We all remarked on the decorations that adorn all the Lobby and Hallway Bulletin Boards. At this point Marianne noted that they have taken the entertainment to the patients to another level. Instead of having the various holiday entertainment in the Auditorium, they have taken it all to the bedsides. Thanksgiving, they had a "Great Turkey" person go room to room giving hugs and words of encouragement. They have professional actors and actresses, dressed in "Showtime" attire that hit the ward from the top down to the Waiting Rooms and even the Canteen. Even though we

haven't yet finished out this year, her department is already making planes for the Valentine Day celebrations. Beauty Queens such as Miss USA; Miss Black USA; Miss Los Angeles: Miss Chinatown just to name a few, will come in, many in their native dress and move from room-toroom merely to chat with the patients. The Veterans Day Parade has been replaced with an Open House, with a Carnival atmosphere that is enjoyed by patient and/or their family members. These same activities are taken on separate days to the other facilities that fall under the umbrella of the GLAHS, which include Sepulveda, Downtown L.A., Bakersfield, and Santa Barbara.

Our next stop was to pay a visit to the new Women's Health Clinic. The Lobby is outfitted with beautiful soft furniture and live plants to reflect the "homey look".

Everything a woman patient would need is there. From medical advise to even a new frock. And... whatever help they might seek, they are greeted by calm and kind employees and volunteers.

It is important to note here, that of the 80,000 outpatients serviced throughout the VA facilities, 6% of these are women. And, included in these numbers are over 900 vets who were injured in the conflict in Iraq. Treating all these vets are VA systems from San Luis Obispo to Downtown Los Angeles, to the South Bay.

Marianne then took us to the 4th

Floor, Surgical Department where construction was under way and will eventually provide a "Patients Family Area". Here, the visiting family members will have the conveniences of a lounge furnished with lounge chairs and couches, refrigerator stocked with fresh fruit and beverages, and even beds for those who require badly needed sleep. Marianne pointed out that all the patient's progress and the performances of the doctors can now be tracked by computerization. Another breakthrough by the VA to provide our vets with top-notch care.

We, who make these visits, are well aware that none of this renovation would be possible without donations from the private and business sector. Of course, with \$2.5M in material things and cash, the "powers that be" have been able to make it happen here at GLAHS., And, being close to "Hollywood" doesn't hurt. The movie studios pay a handsome \$3,000-\$5,000 per day to rent space in the various facilities. In fact, anyone of you who watch the TV show "Grey Anatomy", that is filmed at Sepulveda location.

For any of you who have been on the huge campus of the GLAHS, you will recall one of the many historical buildings, the Brentwood Theatre. I remember a few years back, during our BVL visit, we were taken to the theatre to see the Electronic Bingo Board and Popcorn Machine purchased from BVL

Funds we donated. They held those Bingo Parties seven days a week in the theatre. The vets loved it. Well, the Bingo Parties had to be moved to another location. Recently, a theatre company run by David Geffen, partner to David Spielberg contracted with GLAHS to lease the theatre for two years. In that interim, they completely renovated the building to suit their needs and when the contract was up, they moved out.... Leaving behind an unbelievably gorgeous building. Another ingenious way to earn income above and be-

yond what the government budgets to the V.A.'s to make our veterans more comfortable.

We ended our tour with the "Nursing Home". We were greeted with much enthusiasm by Chief of the Nursing Home, Marlene Brewster, R.N.; Michelle Mayne, R.N. and Carolyn Brown-Turner, Administrative Officer, Horoica Administrative Officer. Here is where the Restorative Care Program was stared in June, a dream of Chief Brewster's. Michelle and Carolyn work with a staff of Restoration Nursing Assistants who involve the patients in one-hour sessions Tues-day, Wed-nesday and Thursday here at GLAHS (Monday and Friday at Sepulveda) by getting them out of their wheelchairs and become involved in walking, exercise, and water. When the program started, they had about 6-8 patients. It now has become so-o-o popular; they now have 30 plus patients involved. They play music from every era; the music being individualized to suit the respective patient. They sing; they play ball; and they walk, walk, and walk. And... drink a lot of water! One patient has lost over 35 lbs. and another who was so debilitated he would never talk.. to anyone. He now not only talks, but also sings with the music while walking. Some of the patients even stay with the beat of the music using "bongo drums" The group sessions grew too large to continue to use the Dining Room, so they have been taken outdoors, weather permitting, so as to enjoy the fresh air, green grass, plants, and hundreds of trees that surround the building. Now, the staff has designed an-

Now, the staff has designed another activity for this program, a "bicycle-Surrey" where 4-6 patients could peddle themselves around the block. They envision dressing the vehicle up with a fancy colorful awning and provide each patient with matching "caps". Also in their plan is to be able to provide the patients Pedometers so they might keep track of their progress, and for those who are observing between activities, some nice comfortable park benches with the high backs and armrests. These were some to the items that Marianne has included in her "wish list" already submitted to our BVL Committee for this next season. In fact, Marianne was well prepared by including the details on the company, located in Santa Barbara that sells these vehicles.

Although patients are discharged or go home on a "Pass", all the facilities have now implemented a "follow-up" program whereby they telephone the patient to see how they are managing. If after several attempts, they are unable to reach them, any known family members are notified and they intervene to see if everything is okay. We were told that this procedure has avoided some "close calls" such as a patient who had fallen in a diabetic coma, received the treatment needed and has recovered

I think you must agree that for the past several years, we have heard poor reports from patients who have used the services at the V.A. As Marianne said to us at the end of our day... "Getting our reputation back is a hard and long term endeavor. Rest assured, we never could have come this far here at this facility or any of our other facilities without help from the public sector. And, trust me, our people truly know who The California BVL Fund is, for you are at the top of our list of organizations who donate to the betterment of our veteran's healthcare

They indeed, have their hands full and their need for financial help will never go away. This clearly means, that we continue to make our plea for your support to our local associations who work so hard to raise money for the California BVL Fund.

And... spread the word! The V.A. Healthcare System has a "New Image"

Ten Pin Slants

Bud Fisher, an oldtime newspaperman, was one of a kind. I say was because Fisher died at his home in Indianapolis on Dec. 9 after a lengthy illness. He was 83.

Early in his career, Fisher left his job at the Akron Beacon Journal to try his hand at public relations. He turned out to be a natural.

Fisher became a pitchman for a variety of sports, including basketball, wrestling, auto racing and even rodeos. Bowling followed.

When Eddie Elias founded the Professional Bowlers Assn. in 1958, the first three men he hired were Joe Antenora, Harry Golden and Bud Fisher. I don't know how much Fisher knew about bowling at that time, but he soon became one of the very best at promoting the sport.

A month or so before each PBA tournament, Fisher would head for the host city. He would drum up publicity for the event by speaking to members of the media—radio, TV and newspapers. He probably knew more sports editors than anyone in the country.

I got to know Fisher fairly well in the late '70s and early '80s, when Gable House Bowl in Torrance sponsored a series of PBA tournaments. The proprietor of Gable House Bowl was Jack Cogan, who knew the value of publicity and promoting.

Each year in which Cogan hosted the PBA, he invited media representatives—mostly members of the Southern California Bowling Writers Assn.—to a dinner at an excellent Szechwan restaurant located in the Gable House business complex. After dinner, Bud Fisher would provide everyone with details of the upcoming tournament.

The "new" PBA could use a talented guy like Fisher. I liked what Dick Evans, the Hall of Fame syndicated columnist from Florida, wrote about Fisher: "Bud was a warrior—living life to its fullest and fighting cancer with courage and a little wit."

IT TOOK SEVERAL weeks to land the right man, but the wait was worth it—like finding a diamond in the rough.

The Bowling Centers of Southern California Assn., long without an executive director, had conducted an extensive search to fill the vacant post. Recently, it was announced in the California Bowling News that the BCSCA had hired William Walbrecher.

If anything, Walbrecher is over-qualified for the job. His resume reads like a "Who's Who of Banking." One of the nation's top executives, Walbrecher has been the CEO of three prestigious companies. Before signing on with the BCSCA, he was serving as "a professional consultant to Fortune 500 companies," according to the story in the CBN.

So, why did Walbrecher want to become executive director of the BCSCA? Especially since the salary has to be considerably less that he usually commands.

My guess is because he loves the sport of bowling. Walbrecher, you see, has been a member of the PBA for 25 years.

I don't really know Walbrecher, although I've met him a few times through a mutual friend, John Jowdy, a PBA Hall of Famer and a world-class coach. Walbrecher took lessons from Jowdy, and they eventually became good friends.

In recent years, Walbrecher, a stylish right-hander, has been competing in PBA Senior Tour events and in numerous regional senior tournaments. He has had limited success on the lanes, but it hasn't been due to lack of trying.

Since Walbrecher is more than qualified to direct the BCSCA, it will be interesting to see how long he sticks around. It won't be very long if the proprietors don't give Walbrecher a free hand...and a lot of cooperation.

He could be the best man to come along since the halcyon days of Dick Steinbaugh, who headed the old Bowling Proprietors Assn. of SoCal, which evolved into the BCSCA.

Steinbaugh did a great job of directing the proprietors' group during the '80s and early '90s. And so will Walbrecher.



After qualifying for match play, Dorin-Ballard lost to Scroggins in a close battle, 675-663. She was then ousted in the double-elimination format by losing to Las Vegas southpaw Eric Forkel, 694-609. Of the 466 entrants in the Masters, six were women, with Dorin-Ballard being the highest finisher.

Joe - I met Bud Fisher in 1980 first at AC Del-Co at Gable House. Great guy. 10 Years later I ran into him at a W.I.B.C. convention. He gave me a hug and said "Carol, How ya been?" I hadn't seen him in ten years!! What a memory. Thanks Joe, for you contributions this year. - Carol Mancini -


