Walter Ray Williams Jr. & Friends Win Trios Event for PBA 100th Title

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr., with the help of partners Dennis Lane and Dick Allen, became the first player in PBA history to win a combined total of 100 PBA titles Sunday when the trio won the PBA/PBA50/PBA60 Decker Appraisal Services Baker Trios title, presented by Hammer, at Valley Lanes.

Williams, as the PBA50 player in the group, won his 10th PBA50 Regional title to go along with his 47 PBA Tour titles, 32 PBA Regional titles and 11 PBA50 Tour titles. With his win, Williams broke a tie with fellow hall of famer Pete Weber in their race to become the first 100-title winner in PBA history.

"It was quite amazing watching Walter Ray strike in the 10th to win his 100th title," said Kyle Troup, the PBA player on the runner-up team.

Williams' team defeated top qualifiers Kenny Parks, Dale Csuhta and Troup, 213-201, in the title match to share a \$5,100 first prize.

Mike Wolfe Uses Timeworn Skills to Win PBA Cheetah Championship

Veteran topples youth movement in GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling VIII's first animal pattern finale

RENO, Nev. – Using skills developed as a teenager nearly a quarter century ago, 40-year-old Mike Wolfe of New Albany, Ind., upstaged the Professional Bowlers Association's youth movement when he routed 23-year-old rookie Darren Tang of San Francisco, 279-143, to win the PBA Cheetah Championship presented by PBA Bowling Challenge Mobile Game.

The Cheetah Championship, the first of four PBA animal pattern championships conducted during the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling VIII at Reno's National Bowling Stadium, aired Sunday on ESPN.

Wolfe, playing a treacherous outside angle to the pocket, delivered clutch

strikes throughout the game, to win his fifth career PBA Tour title and first in four years. While the final score makes it look like Wolfe had an easy time, it was only because he was

able to control a thin line between throwing a strike and throwing the ball into the gutter.

"I grew up playing that shot on short oil back in the urethane days," Wolfe said of his formative years. "People always told me Pete Weber was one of the best gutter players ever and I was a fan of his growing up, so I thought it was cool to play out there."

In the title match, Wolfe was seen smiling nervously after throwing a couple of early strikes.

"I thought I threw them in the gutter," he confessed. "The very first shot out of the (commercial) break, I threw it too hard, but it got back to the pocket. There were two shots, at least, that I thought I threw them into the gutter."

Living on the edge of the lane, however, almost resulted in a perfect game. Wolfe's only flaw was leaving a 10 pin in the seventh frame, which he converted for a spare.

Therefore, my Hospitalization extended longer, and now there is no abnormality as a result of the examination.





PBA Announces 14-tournament PBA50 Tour season for 2017

CHICAGO — The Professional Bowlers Association has announced a 14-tournament PBA50 Tour season for 2017 that will include three majors and three PBA60 tournaments exclusively for players 60 years of age and older.

The 2017 season will kick off with a PBA50 and PBA60 doubleheader at Lane Glo Bowl in New Port Richey, Fla., April 15-20. Lane Glo will host the PBA60 Killer 'B' Open April 15-17 to be followed immediately by the PBA50 Pasco County Florida Open April 17-20.

After the Pasco County events, the PBA50 Tour will once again visit The Villages, Fla., for the PBA50 Sun Bowl In The Villages presented by Radical at Spanish Springs Lanes. The tour then heads north for the PBA50 Miller High Life Classic presented by Columbia 300 at George Pappas' Victory Lanes in Mooresville, N.C., and PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open presented by Brunswick at Farmingdale Lanes in Farmingdale, N.Y.

The PBA50 Tour Players Championship makes its debut as the season's first major at long-time PBA host Woodland Bowl in Indianapolis May 13-16.

The senior players then head west for the PBA50 Northern California Classic presented by MOTIV at Harvest Park Bowl May 28-31. Sam's Town in Las Vegas will host the USBC Super Senior Classic June 1-3, and the season's second major, the USBC Senior Masters June 4-10. 

Kulick Retains World Bowling Championship Title in Qatar

QATAR — Kelly Kulick of the United States successfully defended her World Bowling Women's Singles Championship title after defeating Singapore's Hui Fen New in the final on Friday.

The 39-year-old scored 214 in the match at the Qatar Bowling Centre in Doha, bettering New by 19 points.

In the men's side of the competition, Danish bowler Jesper Agerbo beat Malaysia's Rafiq Ismail 256-205 to claim the Championship title.

Kulick claimed victory four years ago in Limassol, Cyprus, and despite having what she admitted before the tournament as a "dry-spell" in terms of winning titles, the American set her sights on retaining the crown.

In the final, she opened up with three consecutive strikes to build a lead.

New stayed in contention throughout the battle, but failing to get a strike in the eighth end saw the crown handed to Kulick once again.

"I honestly feel relieved," Kulick said after her victory.

"It has been a long time since I've been in the winner's circle, but I wanted to defend my title here and I achieved that goal.

"It's been a wonderful weekend in Qatar."

Both semi-finals in the women's draw were United States versus Singapore showdowns, with New beating Shannon Pluhowsky in the first match.

However, Kulick made saw it was not an all-South East Asian final as she held off the challenge of Shayna Ng.

Agerbo put in a dominant performance in the men's singles final as six strikes in a row saw him cruise to victory.

Earlier in the day, Agerbo overcame Finland's Joonas Jahi by 66 points to make the



final, while Ismail defeated Michael Mak of Hong Kong 235-224 in the other semi-final. The next Championships are due to take place in Tokyo, Japan, in 2020.

World Bowling had applied to get the sport included at the Olympic Games in the same country and year, but their bid was rejected.



- DONNA ZIMMERMAN and BOB RAMIREZ were named So. Calif. Bowlers of the Year by the writers.
- Imagine! Bowling centers actually ran ads to attract league bowlers, tournaments, pro shop merchandise and job available. Today the bowling world is a big secret. Is anybody doing anything???
- The Good Year blimp trolled over L.A. with a salute to our sport. "GO BOWLING" was the message to kick off the '65-66 season.
- BOBBY KNIPPLE was on a rampage. 700's in 3 different centers in one week. He made headlines for over 40 years and became a Hall of Famer.
- TIM ALBIN served as Daytime League Co-Ordinator at AIRPORT BOWL. Remember your early days, TIM??
- Here's a team any sponsor would like to buy shirts for. EDDIE JOSEPH'S BOWLING SUPPLY had a championship foursome; EDDIE, MIKE DURBIN, BOB KNIPPLE and JAY ROBINSON!

If you gave them a bad check it was taped on the window for everyone to see! (I used that gimmick in five centers.)
- FOR SALE: SANTA FE BOWLING CENTER in LONG BEACH, immediately!
- ART GODDARD took over the reigns at ARCADIA BOWL and started his first weekend doubles which he became famous for.
- MIKE FESSLER allowed himself to be hypnotized into bowling a 300 game! Oh Sure! Anyway, he started on a ten game striking spree. He pounded the pocket time after time, always dead in the strike zone. He left ONLY single 10 pins and single 7 pins. What did the experiment prove?? What is your opinion???? I don't think its ever been tried again.
- A special section each week was "Sweepstakes Results", which reported the cashers in advertized tournaments. In the November 12 issue, 22 different centers had their payoffs printed. Imagine 22 plus tournaments (sweeps) were held in So. California every weekend. That did not include tournaments that ran more than 4 weeks. Or State action, or national action, or clubs, or pot games, or T.V. clashes, or Blue Chip, or Green Stamps, or league sweeps.


TO THE EDITOR



player match to open the telecast, where he had a more difficult time. In the elimination match, the two players with the highest scores advanced to the championship match. Tang, in his ESPN-television debut, doubled in the 10th frame for a 237 to lead the four finalists.

Wolfe also doubled in the 10th frame, but fired a rocket shot down the middle of the lane for a seven-count fill ball to finish with 223. That almost opened the door for 19-year-old Anthony Simonsen of Austin, Texas, who then needed three strikes in his 10th frame to force a roll-off with Wolfe. Simonsen got the first strike, but missed on his second to finish with a 210. Also eliminated was 28-year-old B.J. Moore III of Greensburg, Pa., who posted a 192 in his ESPN debut in singles competition. "Over the past few years, Belmo (Australian two-handed star and three-time PBA Player of the Year Jason Belmonte) and some of the other young guys have made winning look easy," Wolfe said. "Bowling a first-timer on TV helped, I think. They look at it differently, like I did when I was their age.

"Darren bowled amazingly for his first show, but you just have to use your experience to make good shots. When the little guys (like me) can sneak one out, it's special."

The PBA's World Series animal pattern championships continue with a busy holiday weekend on ESPN including the finals of the Chameleon Championship presented by HotelPlanner.com on Saturday at 10 a.m. followed by a Christmas Day doubleheader – the Scorpion Championship presented by Reno Tahoe USA and the Shark Championship – at 11:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m., respectively. In all three events, a PBA veteran will take on a field of youthful challengers.

For fans who may have missed ESPN's live coverage of the PBA World Championship on Dec. 11, ESPN will present an encore telecast of the PBA's final major championship of 2016 on New Year's Day at 10 a.m.

bowled by himself on Lane 30, showcasing his wicked curve. He rolled ball after ball for 13 hours, 10 minutes, without taking a break to eat.

He played no-tap, a game in which a bowler is awarded a strike if at least nine pins are knocked down on the first shot.

Kolski blistered a 284 in his ninth game – bowling 10 strikes at the start. He scored at least 200 in six of his first 10 games.

He slowed a bit thereafter but still blasted a 261 in his 15th game, a 233 in his 30th game, a 242 in his 39th game, a 253 in his 67th game, a 250 in his 83rd game and a 252 in his 98th game. Kolski hung tough to the end, finishing with a 195 in Game 100.

How many bowlers would have even been standing at that point? Veteran bowler Tom Martino was one of many who paid tribute to Kolski's feat. "He's relentless in practice so he can perfect his game," Martino said.

Bowling so many games wasn't completely foreign to the likeable Kolski. He had previously bowled 85 games in a day

This time, he wanted to last 100 games so he chose notap, where the games go more quickly. Kolski started at 9 a.m. and he threw his last ball after 10 p.m.

Afterwards, he was asked what he learned from the experience. "Mostly about how much endurance it takes to get through them all," Kolski said. "Once you get to 80, you really feel it. I'm just glad I got through 100 games."

A year later, his average was spiking and Kolski cited the benefits of that marathon day. "The 100 games gave me a better perspective on what I was doing wrong," said Kolski, a West Hills resident.

Kolski has ridden the momentum of that 100-game day to the present where he is averaging about 200 in his three leagues – at Winnetka Bowl and Corbin Bowl in Tarzana.


He's still looking for his first perfect game, but he's rolled a few 279 games and has crushed 13 no-tap perfect games. He's also had numerous 700 series.

When Kolski looks back at his 100-game effort, he remembers his marathon effort with fondness. "If not for that, I wouldn't even be thinking about getting to that [next] level," he said.

Would he ever consider bowling 100 games again?

"Possibly, but I'd probably need a sponsor because I couldn't afford to bowl 100 games," he said with a laugh.
