Parker Bohn III Wins PBA Cheetah Championship for 35th Tour Title

Hall of Famer breaks tie with Mark Roth for fifth place on all-time PBA titles list



RENO, NV – Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.Y., defeated England's Paul Moor, 210-206, to win the Professional Bowlers Association's Cheetah Championship at the National Bowling Stadium and move into sole possession of fifth place on PBA's all-time PBA Tour titles list.

The Cheetah Championship, presented by PBA Bowling Challenge Mobile Game, was the first of four "animal pattern" championships contested during the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling VII presented by Silver Legacy. The finals aired Sunday on ESPN.

Bohn, a 52-year-old left-hander, survived a 6-7 split in the ninth frame and threw a strike on his first ball in the 10th after Moor failed to throw a third consecutive strike on his first shot in his 10th frame to give Bohn a chance. With his 35th career PBA Tour title, the PBA Hall of Famer broke a tie with fellow hall of famer Mark Roth for fifth place on the career titles list. He trails only Walter Ray Williams Jr. (47 titles), the late Earl Anthony (43), Norm Duke (38) and Pete Weber (37).

"I didn't exactly make a good pass at the ball in the

ninth frame," Bohn said. "I hung up just a little bit, enough to leave the 6-7, and I said to myself, 'Are you kidding? You just handed (Moor) the title.' At that point, all I could do was sit on the bench and hope."

"When I left the 7 pin, I had a chance and that's all you can ask for. I knew I needed a mark to win and the best way to get a mark is to throw a strike."

Breaking the titles tie with Roth, Bohn said, "is something I never, ever dreamed would be possible. But no matter how many titles I win, and hopefully continued on page 13

Gary Faulkner Jr. Wins Rolltech PBA World Championship for First Title

Memphis left-hander becomes second African American to win PBA Tour title



RENO, NV – Gary Faulkner Jr. of Memphis, Tenn., making his first professional television appearance, defeated top qualifier EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind., 216-178, to win Rolltech Professional Bowlers Association World Championship Thursday at the National Bowling Stadium. He became the second African American in the PBA's 57-year history to win a Tour title.

The PBA World Championship, the crown jewel of the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling VII presented by Silver Legacy, was the culmination of 66 games of qualifying and match play contested on five different lane conditions. The finals aired live on ESPN.

Faulkner, a 25-year-old third-year PBA member, qualified third for the World Championship finals and won three straight matches to join George Branham III of Indianapolis as the PBA's only African American titlists. Branham, now retired, won five times including the 1986 Brunswick Memorial World Open and the 1993 Firestone Tournament of Champions.

Faulkner, who threw two bad shots in three games, threw six strikes on his first eight attempts while Tackett, the only right-hander in

the finals, left three splits in his first five frames to fall behind by 49 pins, and Faulkner never gave him an opening.

"The first shot I was nervous, but after that I didn't think about anything," Faulkner said. "My mind was free. I didn't watch the other guys. I don't show a lot of emotions. My goal is always to win; I didn't come here to lose."

"Over the past year, I felt it coming. I was making small mistakes, but I'd go home and check my stats and fix my mistakes. Those small pins add up over time. I knew I could do it. I visualized it. I had maybe a half hour of nervousness, but I took a nap and came over here to bowl, and that was it."

Faulkner said he never saw Branham bowl, but he

was aware he had a chance to become the second African American titlist.

"That's definitely one thing I tried not to think about, but it's amazing. To be honest, what I did think about is I wanted to shoot 300 on TV."

Faulkner, who anchored Webber International University to the 2012 Intercollegiate Team Championship, won his way into the title match with a 247-237 victory over Ryan Ciminelli of Cheektowaga, N.Y., derailing Ciminelli's bid to become the first player to win three consecutive PBA titles on American soil since PBA Hall of Famer Johnny Petraglia accomplished that feat in 1971. Ciminelli also was trying for his third title of the year and back-to-back majors after winning continued on page 7

Liz Johnson and Danielle McEwan Join PBA League, Trade Adds Drama to 2016 Draft

Eight teams complete rosters for 2016 PBA League competition in Portland, Maine

RENO – The two-time defending Professional Bowlers Association League champion Silver Lake Atom Splitters will make their bid for an Elias Cup “three-peat” in 2016 with a roster led by Chris Barnes, Dick Allen and Tom Daugherty, and completed Thursday when manager Mark Baker added PBA Rookie of the Year contender Matt McNiell and young Swedish two-handed star Jesper Svensson to complete his lineup.

PBA League rosters were filled Thursday during the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling VII presented by Silver Legacy when each of the eight team managers draft two players in a serpentine draft in the reverse order of how they finished in 2015. Earlier in the fall, each manager had protected three players from their 2015 rosters.

The first highlight of Thursday’s draft was the selection of two women who have had success in PBA competition in addition to the newly-revived Professional Women’s Bowling Association. PWBA Player of the Year Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., the winner of the 2015 USBC Queens and Bowlmor AMF U.S. Women’s Open, and the only woman ever to advance to two PBA television finals, was selected in the final round of the draft by Portland Lumberjacks manager Tim Mack. With the next-to-last pick in the draft, Barbasol Motown Muscle manager Del Ballard Jr. added PWBA Tour Championship and recent PBA Regional titlist Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, N.Y., to his roster.

But before the final pick of the draft, Dallas Strikers’ player-manager Norm Duke pulled off a trade with Portland, sending red-hot left-hander Ryan Ciminelli of Cheektowaga, N.Y., and Johnson to Portland in exchange for Texas two-hander Shawn Maldonado and North Carolina’s BJ Moore III.

The first player off the draft board, which consisted of more than 60 PBA members who had expressed their desire to be part of the 2016 draft, was 2014 PBA Rookie of the Year Marshall Kent of Yakima, Wash., by GEICO New York City WTT KingPins manager Carolyn Dorin-Ballard. Motown then selected 18-year-old two-handed player Anthony Simonsen of Princeton, Texas. Third was the Dallas Strikers who picked Ciminelli. Picking fourth, Philadelphia Hitmen manager Jason Couch selected veteran Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Mich. The newly-named Portland Lumberjacks selected Maldonado. Brooklyn Styles manager Johnny Petraglia, represented at the draft by PBA Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III, picked veteran Jason Sterner of Covington, Ga. Last year’s runnerup, L.A. X under manager Andrew Cain, added veteran left-hander Patrick Allen of Mount Kisco, N.Y. Silver Lake completed the round by picking rookie Matt McNiell of Prior Lake, Minn.

The final round of picks prior to the last-minute trade included Swedish two-hander Jesper Svensson (Silver Lake), Colombia’s Andres Gomez (L.A. X), Rhode Island’s Jon VanHees (Brooklyn), North Carolina’s B.J. Moore (Portland), Ohio’s David Wodka (Philadelphia), Liz Johnson (Dallas), McEwan (Motown) and the KingPins, with the final pick, selected New York native John Szczerbinski. The draft was covered live, exclusively on PBA’s online bowling channel, Xtra Frame.

Johnson and McEwan became the second and third women selected for PBA League competition. Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., was picked for the inaugural 2013 PBAL season by Los Angeles and subsequently traded to New York City.

The PBA League will return to Portland, Maine, for two days of competition on April 2 and 3 for delayed telecast over a span of four consecutive Sundays, April 17-May 8, on ESPN. All four PBA League shows will air at 1 p.m. ET.

What League Bowlers Can Learn From Tom Daugherty’s 100 Game

Not too long ago, a bowler in a Los Angeles-area league apparently got frustrated over a shot that she felt deserved a better result.

“Frustrated” may be putting it a bit mildly.

After leaving the dreaded 7-10 split, this woman picked up two bowling balls – one in each hand – and slung them one after another at the two pins as her fellow bowlers looked on in astonishment.

Her first shot landed safely in the gutter and her second shot crashed into the sweep bar – fortunately bouncing off and causing no damage.

This show of disrespect for the game happens more often than people realize as anger takes hold – especially during the course of league play when end-of-the-season payouts serve as incentive to bowl consistently above one’s average.

League players also have been known to bounce their bowling balls off the floor when their shots misfire – often triggering a scary boom reverberating around the bowling center.

These disenchanted league players could learn a lesson from professional bowler Tom Daugherty. His actions at a big-money tournament, which were recently described in a California Bowling News story, were decidedly upbeat despite a downbeat performance.

Showing grace and good humor during his semifinal match in the 2011 Tournament of Champions, Daugherty had the crowd eating out of his hand at the end as he couldn’t catch a break.

Splits on frames one, three, five, six, eight, nine and 10 would have had lesser people kicking the ball return. Instead, the right-handed Daugherty kept chucking his ball down the lanes the best he could, hoping his string of misery would end – at some point.

It never did.

But the unshakeable Daugherty – a member of this year’s Elias Cup champion Silver Lake (Calif.) Atom Splitters in the Professional Bowlers Assn. League – celebrated when he knocked down two pins of his 4-6-7-10 split on his last shot to allow him to reach an even 100. And the fans celebrated with him, as he traded high-fives with much of the gathering with a big smile on his face.

And speaking of money, the Tournament of Champions winner that year earned a \$250,000 bonanza, so Daugherty missed out on a spectacular payoff.

Mika Koivuniemi, who bowled with Daugherty on the Atom Splitters last season, defeated Daugherty, 299-100, in that one-sided semifinal match. Daugherty finished with two strikes and eight opens. Koivuniemi went on to win the Tournament of Champions title. (Daugherty still won \$50,000 for finishing third.)

It’s worth watching the video of the Koivuniemi-Daugherty match online to see how someone can handle big-time misfortune without testily dribbling his bowling ball off the floor.

After watching the match, one can conclude that Koivuniemi was not the only winner in that tournament.

Who Will Be the First L.A Bowler to Roll a 900 Series?

WINNETKA – It’s going to happen. It’s just inevitable. With local bowlers piling up perfect games, one thing seems to be missing.

That’s a 900 series by an L.A.-area bowler. That means a bowler has to roll three 300s in their series. That takes 36 strikes, 12 in each game. Sure, pressure will mount as the strike count rises. But that’s what makes the achievement so special.

It’s certainly doable for an elite bowler. It’s so doable. It’s just a matter of when.

That’s not to diminish the thrill of bowling a single 300. The overwhelming majority of nationwide bowlers have never experienced the sheer joy of rolling such a masterpiece and then being engulfed by a sea of admiring and congratulating well-wishers.

Just one perfect game is a big deal.

Bryan Alpert, who has rolled dozens of 300s (both left-handed and right-handed) once said that he still treasures each and every perfect game.

“You never know when you won’t do it again,” said Alpert, the manager of Corbin Bowl in Tarzana. “You really try to appreciate it. It’s still pretty rare.”

There are snack bars in bowling centers that commemorate perfect games by being named things like “300 Grill.”

And bowlers frequently tout their 300 achievements on their license plates. And emails are often concocted with “300” in them as testament to the feat. In fact, perhaps the top woman pro bowler has “300” in her email – not surprising considering she’s rolled perfect games so often.

There also is a searchable database at the International Bowling Hall of Fame in St. Louis that marks every 300 rolled.

But back to the 900 series.

It’s not as if it’s impossible. Many players have done it – just not in L.A County.

For a point of reference, the United States Bowling Congress lists 27 bowlers who have rolled a 900 three-game series.

That does not include Glenn Allison, who bowled a much-written-about 900 in 1982 in Orange County that has gone uncertified. So here is the list of those elite bowlers who have accomplished the feat, according to the USBC:

A couple of notes about that list: Mushtare achieved the feat twice – it all happened within a three-month period.

Five lefties hit the 900 mark; the rest were right-handed.

Two on the list turned the trick in California – both in Riverside County.

So who are the likely 900 bowlers from this area? A nice place to look for candidates is the Bill Mossontte Majors league that takes place Wednesday nights at Corbin Bowl. It’s a high-roller league and many of the bowlers sport lofty averages, such as Tim Tripp (243), Charles Kenny (239), Zarcoff Boutell (234), Matt Jones (231), Paul Bober (231) and Eddie Vandanker (230).

Kenny has blasted a phenomenal 865 series and Tripp likewise has blistered an 858 so they’re both knocking on the door. A couple of years ago, Kenny acknowledged that 900 was his goal. Should Kenny hit that magic 900, no one who has seen him bowl would probably be too surprised.

Said top bowler Rick Auerbach: “Charles Kenny hits the pins so hard I told him that on my way home I would look for some pins on Ventura Boulevard.”

And no list would be complete without including Alpert, who has carved out a spot in the USBC record book for his ambidextrous bowling skills.

Incidentally, let’s not leave out women candidates, such as United States Bowling Congress Hall-of-Famer Robin Romeo. She’ll always be remembered as being the first (and so far only) woman to win a West Coast Senior Tour event – and she did it the first time she entered. No woman in the U.S. has bowled a sanctioned 900 – the closest being a pair of 879s.

Wouldn’t that be something if an L.A.-area woman like Romeo, or 2015 California state women’s singles champion Michelle Silver smashed a 900?

Or how about Kelly Gold, who has racked up back-to-back perfect games, or fast-rising Alyse McCown? Anything’s possible.

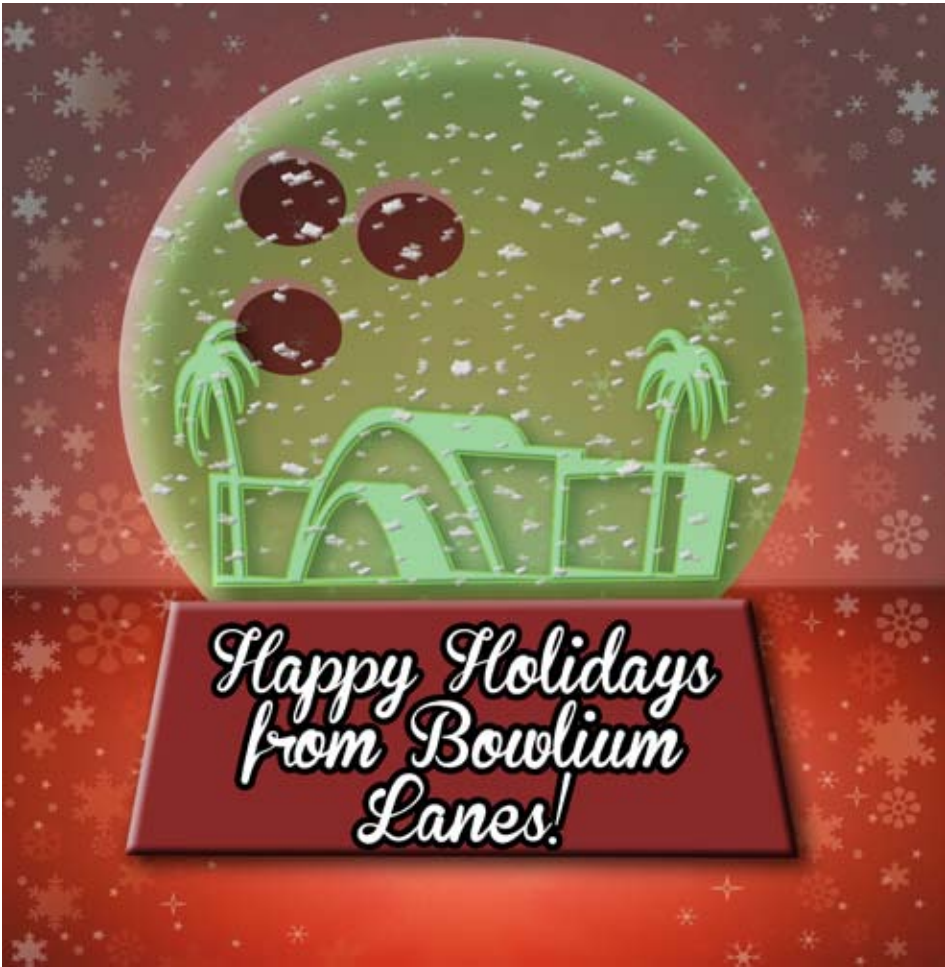
