Tom Smallwood Wins PBA Scorpion for 2nd Title

2009 PBA World Champion ends television drought with victory over collegiate star Marshall Kent

LAS VEGAS – Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Mich., ended a four-year television drought when he defeated collegiate star Marshall Kent of Yakima, Wash., 221-216, to win his second Professional Bowlers Association Tour title in the Scorpion Championship at the South Point Hotel and Casino complex.

The Scorpion Championship, which aired Sunday on ESPN, was the final animal pattern championship conducted as part PBA World Series of Bowling V, and the fourth in a series of seven events conducted during the World Series. It also featured the innovative blue oil that has been used during all animal pattern tournament finals to give television fans a unique opportunity to see the lane conditioning challenges PBA players face.

Smallwood, who won his only previous PBA Tour title in the 2009 PBA World Championship, ended a personal six-appearance television drought when he out-last-ed 2011-12 PBA Rookie of the Year Josh Blanchard of Gilbert, Ariz., in a PBA-record five-frame sudden-death roll-off, followed by another thrilling victory over Kent for the title.

Blanchard started the step-ladder finals with a 234-226 victory over Tommy Jones of

Simpsonville, S.C., but lost to Smallwood in the semifinal match roll-off. A six-count on his final shot in the 10th frame tied the match at 232-232. After throwing matching strikes in four one-ball, sudden-death frames, Smallwood ended the longest televised sudden-death roll-off in PBA history with a fifth strike while Blanchard left a 10 pin.

In the title match against Kent, a two-time Collegiate Player of the Year who was competing in the World Series on a special PBA Commissioner's exemption, Smallwood struck on six of his first seven shots, but failed to convert a 3-10 split in the fourth frame. Kent, with a four-strike string of his own, held an early 13-pin lead, but a 7-10 split in the ninth frame proved to be the difference. A spare and nine-count on his fill ball in the 10th frame clinched the title for Smallwood.

"I thought if I ever made another show and won, I'd bawl like a baby," Smallwood said, "but I was so emotionally drained, I didn't have any emotions left.

"It's amazing," he added. "I never dreamed in my life I'd have one (title), so to have two? As a kid, all I ever wanted was a chance to be there. I watched these guys on TV forever. I've bowled bad enough

on TV enough times it's nice to be on the other side of a bad break. That last time I was (on TV), I got knocked out of the World Championship when I left back to back 4-9s, so I know the feeling."

Smallwood said the difference was finding his shot to the pocket in the roll-off against Blanchard.

"In the roll-off (against Blanchard), my timing got really good. The first shot was perfect, it was like, there it is," Smallwood said. "After that, I never missed until the fifth shot and I apparently missed in the right place on that one, so it worked out well."

Smallwood joined the list of animal pattern finalists who said the blue oil had no bearing on his game or the outcome.

"(The blue oil) doesn't matter as long as you can see the target you're looking for," he

said. "It's so clear I could see the board I was looking at, so it had no effect on me at all."

The Scorpion Championship telecast also included the fourth and final PBA League Challenge segment, called the "T.O. Challenge."

Bowlers, Don't Be Dumb.. Be Better

SAN BERNARDINO — Why are bowlers so stupid? Why do WE continue in our same old routines? SAME-Oh, SAME-Oh.

Year in, year out I see bowlers bowling the same way, making the same mistakes. Are we mice in a maze? Can't we see that we are headed no where unless we change. Why do we continue accepting mediocrity? Thoughtless repetition.

I say it's time to TAKE CHARGE. Bowlers, let's start thinking about our game and get better. Step up, break the mold, start your engine and accelerate.

SILLY YOU, giving no thought to improving. I want you to look in the mirror and picture a bowler in progress, a better bowler. DARE TO BE BETTER.

I want to challenge all of you to become better bowlers. I believe anyone can improve. I believe anyone can improve at least twenty pins if you want to. If you are willing to work on your game.

Unfortunately most bowlers just show up for their weekly leagues and follow the same routines. Many are proud to do what they do using only one ball and bowling only three games a week. Do these bowlers ever think about what they are saying? Bragging about doing less. Boasting about doing the minimum to achieve mediocrity.

ENOUGH. I want those of you who really want to improve to start now.

A new year is dawning so lets get started. First of all you need to have goals and a plan to achieve them. Remember, A GOAL WITHOUT A PLAN IS ONLY A WISH.

Your plan should include self evaluation, observation, education, lessons and practice. To succeed your plan must be long range and executed with healthy doses of patience, persistence and optimism. Don't give up. Take occasional breaks, but never give up.

To get started take some time to evaluate your game. During down time, maybe just before falling asleep, think about what you do right and what you do wrong on the lanes. Make a list to work on. Think of things like your approach, footwork, arm swing and release. Are you relaxed, attentive and focused when you bowl? What spares do you miss regularly? Have you ever considered working on any shortcomings?

Once you have a list of things to work on get started. Start by observing some of the better bowlers in your area. I started by watching the best bowlers in my areas top scratch league. Next, start watching the PBA professionals on ESPN television. Note, do more than just watch for entertainment. Pay attention to the details. Watch how the professionals release the ball, their footwork and approach.

Even bowlers need to be educated. I suggest you obtain a good instructional book and read it. Then apply those principles on the lanes. Steve Felege's book "The Perfect Game" is a great place to start.

Next, it's time for some practice. I practice at least once a week for two hours. Professionals practice everyday. When was the last time you practiced? When you practice work on your form, timing, release and weaknesses. If you regularly miss corner pins, bowl at least one practice game a week shooting just corner pins. Yes, you can shoot at corner pins with a full rack. Forget keeping score when practicing and PRACTICE WITH A PURPOSE.

I don't understand why so many ardent bowlers rush to tournaments every weekend but never practice. I suggest practicing three weekends a month and bowling one tournament.

Finally, take a lesson or two. There are many bronze and silver level coaches around. Give one a call.

MAKE A RESOLUTION for next year to take steps to improve. Come on, don't be dumb, DARE TO BE BETTER.

shoot at strikes, that was the easiest one to try to duplicate,” said PBA Hall of Famer and Dallas Strikers franchise player Norm Duke. Owens struck on his first attempt, but Duke failed to match his effort, leaving two pins standing.

Owens got a seven-count for Silver Lake Atom Splitters owner Chris Barnes, and Barnes successfully matched the pin count.

“The T.O. Challenge could have been anything,” Barnes said. “He got lined up, which gave a few guys a chance to do what they do best, which is throw strikes, but only one of them did it. I was lucky to get seven pins and that gave me a chance.”

“We were all hoping (Owens) would get a strike, so I was fortunate that he pulled my name out and he struck,” said Belmonte, L.A. X’s franchise player. “It was just a matter of throwing a good shot and hoping all 10 pins fell, and that’s exactly what happened. I’m glad he pulled my name out, glad he struck and glad I won everything.”

ESPN coverage of the PBA World Series continues next Sunday at 10 a.m. with the finals of the PBA World Championship, the final major championship of the season. Smallwood will make his third consecutive television appearance, bowling against PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., in the opening match. Other finalists are No. 3 qualifier Mike Fagan of Fort Worth, Texas; No. 2 Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., and top qualifier Dom Barrett of England.

A recap of the Scorpion Championship and a preview of the PBA World Championship, along with other features, will be available Monday on “The Bowling Center” on YouTube.com. Xtra Frame subscribers who may have missed Sunday’s telecasts will be able to watch the finals “on demand” in the Xtra Frame archives three days after the original show airs.

ABOUT THE PROS

A pro bowler's opinion of a town is based mostly on how well or how badly he or she bowls there, not whether it is a pleasant or historical site. And you can bet that a bowler's opinion of a lane condition is in direct proportion to how well it was hit. To a winner, it's the best. To the runner-up, it's excellent. To the casher, it's fair to good. And to the also rans, it's not a matter of pleasant conversation.

Soaker or no soaker (bowling ball dipped in various chemical(s) to give extra action) Don McCune was the most abused Bowler of the Year in history in 1973 because he fathered and mastered the soaker, now banned. But McCune came back in 1974 to prove his ability, winning \$33,000 (excellent earnings then) without winning a tournament. Today's legal bowling balls make yesteryear's soakers look like backup balls.

A pro bowler would be a fool to suffer the frustrations and instabilities which almost inevitably are a part of the career, unless he or she firmly believed some day would bring stardom, and all that goes with it.

Pro bowlers really aren't superstitious, but some claim it's a scientific fact that they roll much better while wearing certain colors.

Marshall Holman on Marshall Holman: "I'm an emotional player. If I were passive I'd be mediocre. My actions are spontaneous, and I can no more control them than other players can change to the way I react. It's the way I work. What I do is gut and heart reactions. You just don't change them that easily."

Winners of pro tournaments don't forget. They remember how to win and the feeling it brings, and that can keep them going for a long time—no matter what.

Most bowling pros make it by taking one more chance, over and over again. The dismal failures have no problem. They soon realize they can't make it, at least most of them do, and pack it in. The fringe players, the ones who cash fairly often, but seldom win the big money, have it the toughest. They just get by, hoping for that big win or big year that always seems to be a game or a strike away from their grasp. Quite a few, if they had to do it over again, might take a regular job, and be the best bowler in their shop or office. Others are quite candid, and freely admit, that the tour, even when the going is rough, is a lot better than most jobs.

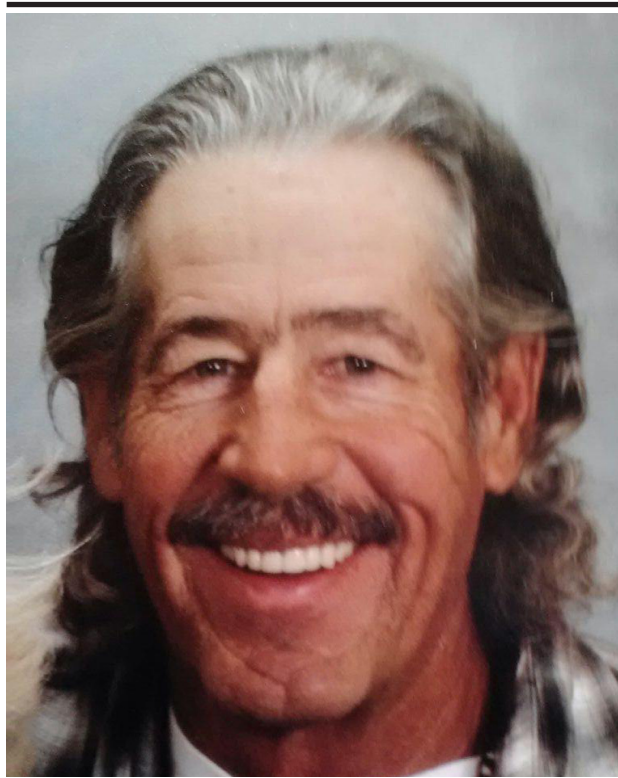
In every way, on and off the lanes, Carmen Salvino has given his all for bowling, almost as though it has been his personal crusade. And all you can ask or demand of yourself or anyone else is that they give their best.

Bowling is a funny game, even though it wasn't meant

to be. Isn't every bad break, spooky pinfall, or curious happening in bowling funny, so long as it happens to someone else? And talking about funny, what happened in San Jose, Calif., in 1971 wasn't funny to the righthanders in the field. All 16 match play qualifiers were lefthanded.

No sport has as many athletes so close together in ability as bowling. On any given week, any one of more than 50 pros rates almost an equal chance to win any given tournament. The margin difference is often one good game or good shot or one lucky or unlucky break.

Some pro bowlers beat up their hands so badly that when you shake hands with them it's like sticking your hand into a bag of walnuts.

The Perfect Game

The Complaint Dept. sponsored by Carol Mancini

Carol: That was quite an interview, Stevie. I think we all learned a lot about how differently you think about bowling technique. I was a little disappointed though.

Steve: About what?

Carol: You didn't really explain how principles, theory and technique fit together.

Steve: Okay, let me try another way.

Carol: NO! The interview is over!

Steve: Here goes.....Universal principles lead to theories. Theories lead to techniques. Those techniques test the theories. If the techniques are effective, the theory is correct. Are you with me so far?

Carol: My head's starting to hurt.....again!!!

Steve: The principles I relied on are:

1. Bowling is a game of skill (skill = accuracy + consistency).
2. The ball can only do what you cause it to do.
3. The ball travels a line.

Carol: So far, so good.....

Steve: The delivery consists of four basic but separate skills and each requires its own theory. Those skills are the stance, the push-away, the arm-swing and the release. Your delivery knits them together. Still with me?

Carol: I think so.....

Steve: Take the first skill: The Stance. Using those three principles, we can state this theory: "The most effective bowling stance requires you, the bowler, to consistently place the ball directly over a line which terminates at the pin(s) said ball is intended to contact. It must also influence the entirety of the approach in such a way that the aforementioned ball remains unerringly vertical to said line up to and including the moment of its release."

Carol: What?! Can you say that using English?

Steve: Sure. The most effective stance gets the ball directly over its target-line and helps ensure that it stays there.

Carol: Why didn't you just say so in the first place?

Steve: What fun would that be? Remember, some of your readers complained that my book was too simple.

Carol: I'll bet they're more grateful now!

Steve: I hope so. Now, in light of that theory it's easy to see why the old stances are less effective than the one proposed in my book. They required the bowler to line the ball up with its target at some point during the approach.

Carol: So now you're trying to promote sales of your book?

Steve: Of course. Your broom closet isn't really all that comfortable! But more importantly I want bowlers to understand that they can adjust, or completely reinvent, their own deliveries using the principles and theories we're describing here. To improve their stance, they simply need to get in front of a mirror and see if it adheres to the basic theory. In other words, does it get the ball on its target-line?

Carol: And if it doesn't.....?

Steve: They can modify it. The closer they get the ball to being in line with their shoulder, the more consistently they will hit their target. I guarantee it! The same is true for the other skills as well. The step-by-step instructions in my little manual just make the process easier. Shall we move on to the push-away?

Carol: Could I possibly stop you at this point?

Steve: Probably not.

Carol: Then go ahead.....

Steve: Again, using those three principles, we can state this theory for The Push-Away: "The most effective push-away requires you, the bowler, to consistently initiate forward movement of the ball along a straight line which leads said ball to its target. The height of the ball at the end of the push-away must also be consistent due to the gravitational force which initiates acceleration of said ball at this point. A higher push-away allows for a longer period of gravitational influence which results in greater downward velocity. Conversely, a lower push-away creates less ball speed. Since direction and speed is of utmost importance to ball/lane interaction, the need for consistency is self-evident."

Carol: In English.....please!!!

Steve: The push-away tells the ball where you want it to go. The height of the ball at the end of the push-away determines the speed of the shot.

Carol: You know, I'm surprised by the number of bowlers, pros included, that totally ignore this skill.

Steve: Un-huh. There's a term I use for those people.

Carol: What is it? Losers?

Steve: If you already knew that, why'd you ask?

Carol: We're running out of time again. Can you give us the short version of arm-swing theory?

Steve: Sure. The same basic principles result in the following theory for The Arm-Swing: "The most effective arm-swing requires you, the bowler, to consistently swing the ball straight along its target-line in pendulum fashion, conserving the energy developed during its vertical drop (which began at the end of the push-away). Consistency of said arm-swing along the target-line is maintained by limiting the arc travelled to degrees which prevent the twisting of your upper torso."

Carol: I have no idea what you just said, but we still have time for the release! Same principles.....Go!

Steve: The Release theory states:

"The most effective release requires you, the bowler, to maintain uniform wrist position and consistently release your grip on the ball at precisely the same point in your approach without altering its line of travel. This moment ideally occurs when the forward portion of your arm-swing reaches vertical"

Carol: Can't you just say, "Let go of the ball the same way every time."?

Steve: You just did.

Carol: So that's It? What about using your fingers and applying lift?

Steve: Carol, that's advanced technique. I'm discussing only the absolute basics because they alone produce the precise accuracy and velocity required for success. EVERYTHING beyond this is advanced and requires practice to maintain consistency. All bowlers become advanced with experience. I am only proposing the basics for them to build upon because, as your mentor said, "There are two ways to get good; practice a lot.....or practice doing things the right way." Over 25 years ago Robert Fulghum wrote a book titled, All I needed to know I learned in Kindergarten. I would say most of what anyone needs to know about bowling technique is contained in, The Essentials of Bowling: Second Edition.

Carol: Nice plug, Stevie!

Steve: Thanks, but do you see how principles, theories and technique relate to each other now?

Carol: Actually, I think I do. So.....when can we start running your book again?

Steve: Any time you have space to fill.

Carol: Hey, Dean! Did you hear that? MORE FREE "COPY"!

Dean: Yeah.....more work for me.....whoopee.....

Steve: Nyuck, nyuck, nyuck.....

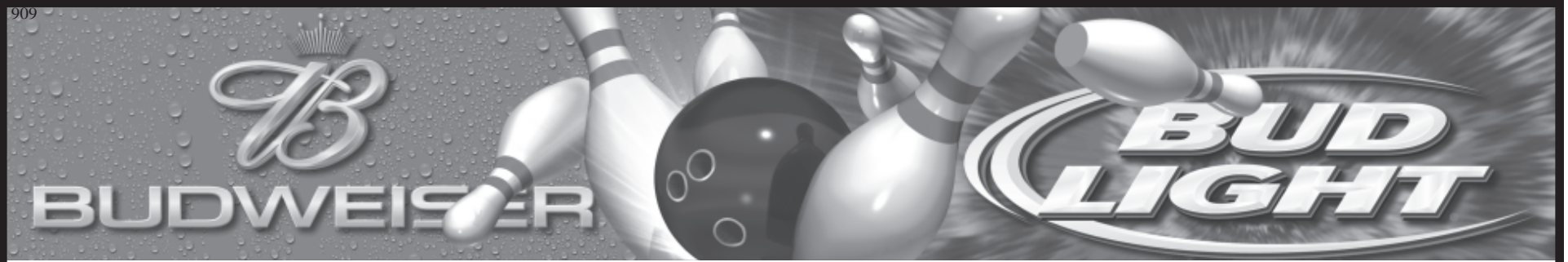
