Marshall Kent Wins 2018 PBA Clash in Landmark FOX Sports Telecast

Kent defeats Dom Barrett, 218-215, in title match after surviving two elimination roll-offs

LAKE WALES, Fla. - Four-time PBA Tour winner Marshall Kent of Yakima, Wash., outlasted seven other top money earners from the 2018 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season to win the PBA Clash, taking home the \$25,000 winner-take-all first prize while ushering in a new era of sports television coverage for the PBA on FOX Sports.


Kent defeated seven-time tour and 2018 U.S. Open winner Dom Barrett of England, 218-215, in the title match that aired on FOX Sunday after surviving two elimination roll-offs at the Kegel Training Center.

Down by 18 in the eighth frame, Kent finished the match with five strikes to go around Barrett who left a 10 pin on his first ball of the 10th frame after a double in the eighth and ninth frames, ending his hopes for the win.

The Clash marked PBA's landmark debut on FOX which will begin its 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour coverage with the PBA Hall of Fame Classic at 8 a.m. on Sunday, Jan. 6 on FS1.

The eliminator format event showcased the season's top eight money earners from the 2018 season. Joining Kent and Barrett in the field were other top earners Jason Belmonte, Anthony Simonsen, 2018 Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year Andrew Anderson, EJ Tackett, Stuart Williams and Jakob Butturff.

Winnetka Bowl Team Breezes to Fab 5 State Tournament Title

LAKEWOOD - There was a new kid on the block in the winner's circle at the 2018 Fab 5 state tournament. This time a team representing Winnetka Bowl in the San Fernando Valley claimed the championship of the prestigious event, ending a three-year stranglehold by Forest Lanes.

The Valley team of "No Spares," consisting of captain Denny Jiramoree, Mark Alvarino, Jocelyn Bustamante, John Ritchie and Karl Gatmaitan, earned the title and split a payoff of more than \$1.500.

The tournament was held Dec. 9 at Cal Bowl in Lakewood.

The Fab 5 is a handicap tournament and features a team Baker format.

Under this format, each of the team's five players bowls two frames per game. The team's anchor, for instance, bowls in frames 5 and 10.

"Throughout the tournament, it was pretty much Mark Alvarino and John Ritchie holding things down," Jiramoree said.

"No Spares" earned the No. 1 seeding for the threeteam stepladder finals and then cruised to victory in the championship match against a team from Fountain Bowl.

Jiramoree, the leadoff bowler, struck to get things going in the finals. Then Bustamante followed with soon bolted into an insurmountable lead.

"It was one of the first times John didn't have to worry about anything," said Jiramoree about Ritchie, the anchor bowler.

Ritchie carried a 211 average into the tournament. Gatmaitan was next at 188, Alvarino 187, Jiramoree 184 and Bustamante 151.

Alvarino has made the another strike and the team news before. He won the 14-month-long

2015 at Winnetka Bowl.

Jiramoree said the team bowled its best game in the qualifying round right off the bat. "We bowled about a 260 that first game," he "We pretty much bowled average the rest of the way. The first game carried us [into the top seeding for the stepladder]."

Potential Career Milestones We Could See In 2019

Every sport has its own records and accomplishments all players hope to reach and exceed, and part of the reason those milestones are so important is because they happen so infrequently.

As the PBA moves into 2019, there's a feasible chance we could see multiple players achieve some of the most elite milestones in professional bowling.

First, let's get the absurd out of the way: yes, someone could theoretically win 14 or more titles, including all the majors, average 300 and earn over \$4,000,000 in 2019.

That would be fantastic, however, we needn't be that outlandish. There are some huge moments within reach, realistically, of several players this year.

Someone completes the Triple Crown

Only six players in the history of the PBA Tour have claimed the PBA Triple Crown, and all of them are unsurprisingly in the Hall of Fame. Billy Hardwick, Johnny Petraglia, Mike Aulby, Pete Weber (who has actually earned the Triple Crown twice), Norm Duke and Chris Barnes are the only players in the 60-year history of the PBA Tour to collect the necessary titles.

Why is it so difficult? To win the Triple Crown, a player has to win each of the three original PBA majors: the World Championship (formerly National Championship), Tournament of Champions and U.S. Open, which always have been and still are three of the most difficult bowling tournaments to win.

This year, three players in particular have a chance to claim the third jewel of the crown. EJ Tackett, who won the 2016 World Championship and 2017 Tournament of Champions, nearly finished the job at the 2018 U.S. Open, before falling to eventual champion Dom Barrett in the stepladder finals.

Barrett, who added the 2018 U.S. Open title to his 2013 World Championship victory, is now a Tournament of Champions win away from collecting a Triple Crown of his own. If Barrett can win the Tournament of Champions and Tackett claims the U.S. Open, we could actually see two players complete the Triple Crown in 2019.

There's one other player – Jason Belmonte – who can viably complete the Triple Crown this year and doing so would simultaneously mean quite a bit more.

Belmonte accomplishes everything at once

Belmonte has won every major championship except one, the U.S. Open, and has a total of nine majors already in his career. If Belmonte is able to win the 2019 U.S. Open, he would not only become the seventh Triple Crown winner (eighth if Barrett wins the TOC in February), but he would also become just the third player ever (along with Aulby and Duke) to win the Grand Slam, which adds the USBC Masters, a title Belmonte has already won four times, to the three Triple Crown events.

Even more impressive, since Belmonte also owns two Players Championship titles, he would join Aulby as the only two players to have accomplished the Super Slam, which includes all five major championships on the current PBA Tour.

All that kicks in at once if Belmonte wins the U.S. Open. However, Belmonte can also tie and/or break the all-time record for PBA major championships in 2019, even before we get to the U.S. Open. Earl Anthony and Pete Weber share the record with 10 career major titles, and Belmonte's next would be his 10th. If he can somehow win two majors in 2019, he'll become the greatest major champion in PBA history.

Of course, if Weber gets healthy and wins a major of his own (his last major came in the 2013 Tournament of Champions), then Belmonte will have a little more work to do.

Weber or Barnes finalize Grand Slam

The hypothetical Barnes-Weber title match in the USBC Masters is getting less likely each year but fans can still hope. The two all-time greats famously lack this title and have combined for five runner-up finishes (three for Barnes, two for Weber).

Players join elite 20-title group

Only 14 players, all Hall of Famers, have won 20 or more times on the PBA Tour. This season, we could conceivably see three players win their 20th titles. Barnes, who won his 19th championship at the 2018 PBA Xtra Frame Lubbock Sports Open, is one win away. Belmonte is two wins away as is Tommy Jones, who just extended his contract with Ebonite and is in a career-long game of one-upmanship with Barnes over who currently has the most championships.

Someone breaks the single-season earnings record

As announced in October, if a player bowls a 300 game in the championship match of one of four consecutive live telecasts (Tournament of Champions, Players Championship, Indianapolis Open, Jonesboro Open), that player wins \$1,000,000.

Another note on the million dollars is that it counts toward the money list, just as the traditional \$10,000 bonus for a 300 game counts.

Yes, it's unlikely to happen. If it does, though, the winner of the million will also become the PBA record holder for most money earned in a season. Walter Ray Williams Jr. currently holds that record from the 2002-03 season, when he earned \$417,450.

Best, most outlandish case: the same person wins all four events, rolls 300 in every title match and banks \$4,000,000 on top of the first-place prize money, setting both the single-season and lifetime earnings records, then presumably retires, never to touch a bowling ball again.

The telecast began with each bowler rolling a 10th-frame opening round with the low score eliminated. Seven players advanced to the second round where all players competed in a one-ball low-man-out format with the last two survivors bowling a complete game in the title match.

In the 10th frame round, Tackett, the 2016 Player of the Year and the only three-time winner in 2018, was eliminated with an eight count for the frame after leaving the 2-4-10 split.

Kent and Barrett went on to survive the one-ball elimination rounds to advance to the title match.

For the unique format, Kent kept things simple using the same ball for the entire tournament while making his adjustments with ball speed and angles to the pocket.

"I prepared like I do for any other tournament," said Kent, who benefited from two crossover strikes in the oneball elimination rounds. "There weren't a lot of frames to bowl and there was no re-oiling (of the lanes) so I just made it work with one ball."

After the 3-6-7-10 split and an open in the fifth frame of the title match, Kent put his ability to adjust to the test and got back on track with a strike in the sixth and a nine-spare in the seventh before striking the rest of the way.

"It was pressure all the way but I love the pressure," Kent said. "The last half of the match I was able to find some area to the right so I just needed to play smart from that point. Obviously, the most pressure was on the strike in the ninth so after I got that strike and all three in the 10th I felt like I did my part; then it was just wait and see what Dom does."

The revolutionary Specto StrikeTrack was introduced during the Clash telecast, giving viewers the ability to follow the path of the ball going down the lane while providing ball performance data in real time. StrikeTrack is similar in concept to the FOX Sports FlightTrack system used on PGA Tour telecasts that tracks the flight of a golfer's shot.

The Clash marked the return of veteran FOX sports-caster Rob Stone as play-by-play PBA announcer after a five-year absence, again teaming with color commentator and PBA Hall of Famer Randy Pedersen along with sideline reporter Kimberly Pressler.

The telecast also included features on all eight players, a preview of the 2019 season and presentations by PBA CEO and Commissioner Tom Clark to Andrew Anderson for his Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year Award and Kamron Doyle for his Harry Golden PBA Rookie of the Year honor.

As the debut of the Go Bowling! PBA Tour rapidly approaches its debut on FOX, FOX Sports continues to add good news to its budding relationship with the PBA.


First, FOX has created a bowling page on <u>FoxSports.com</u>, its official website, that will be filled with PBA player interviews and other news of interest to bowling fans. The website presence means additional availability of PBA news to millions of sports fans around the world, and includes a link to <u>pba.com</u> where fans can find all kinds of additional schedule, background and statistical information.


Secondly, FOX has announced an extensive schedule of re-airs of PBA telecasts, including 14 re-broadcasts of Sunday's PBA Clash on FS1 and FS2. That means that fans who may miss the initial telecast will have ample opportunities to watch the shows when they re-air. Because the schedules are so extensive, it's always best to check your local listings for dates and times for those telecasts.

Third, a few FOX stations have exercised their options to pre-empt Sunday's PBA Clash telecast from its regularly-scheduled 2:30 or 4:30 p.m. time (depending on your home market) and will air the show at a different time. A handful of the 210 markets with FOX stations have elected to re-schedule the telecast. Included are: Atlanta, Augusta, Charlotte, Dallas-Ft. Worth, Green Bay, Miami, Milwaukee, Minneapolis, San Francisco and Tampa. Fans in those markets should check their local listings for the re-scheduled air time on FOX, and also check their FS1 and FS2 channels for PBA Clash air times.

Fourth, a video preview of Sunday's PBA Clash is now available on PBA's You-Tube channel if you'd like to get a sneak peek at the show: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=gvlnHsugY78.

Finally, the PBA Tour will be available in a variety of other outlets, including satellite radio. Viewers can live stream the PBA shows on the FOX Sports app, through the FOX and FS1 streams. The shows will be available on desktop at <u>FOXSports.com</u> and through the app store or on connected devices including Apple TV, Android TV, Fire TV, Xbox One and Roku. In addition, all programs will be available on FOX Sports on SiriusXM channel 83 on satellite radios and on the SiriusXM app.


PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: END-OF-SEASON EVENTS RESULT IN TWO FIRST-TIME TITLISTS

As the PBA Regional season draws to a close for 2018, two weekend tournaments resulted in first-time title winners in the PBA South and combined Central-East Regions:

- Nate Garcia of Port St. Lucie, Fla., celebrated his 24th birthday Sunday by winning
 his first PBA Regional title, defeating PBA Tour veteran Tom Daugherty of Riverview,
 Fla., 230-214, to win the PBA Reality Check/CareHawk Classic at Sawgrass Lanes in
 Tamarac, Fla.
- Garcia, the number four qualifier for the stepladder finals with a 17-game pinfall total of 3,490, easily defeated PBA rookie Mike Coffey of Melbourne, Fla., 180-151, in the opening stepladder match. He then eliminated Andro Simounet of Lake Wales, Fla., 202-179, to advance to the championship match of the PBA South Region's final tournament of 2018. Garcia pocketed \$2,800.
- In Warren, Ohio, Jay Davis of Silver Spring, Md. defeated John Brockway of Hudson, Ohio, 186-182, to win his first PBA Regional title in the Warren Harley-Davidson Central/East Challenge at Freeway Lanes of Warren Sunday.
- Davis, who earned \$1,500, downed Larry Woomer of State College, Pa., 225-157, and Brockway topped Tim Pfeifer of Oakdale, Pa., 222-187, in the semifinal round to set up the championship match. Challenge tournaments are open to PBA members who have not won a PBA title and non-PBA members who have never won a PBA event.
- Closing out PBA's 2018 regional calendar will be the PBA50/PBA Houston Emerald Bowl Doubles presented by Bowling Dynamix over the Dec. 21-23 weekend, and the PBA Japan Region's Scorpion and Women's Scorpion Open tournaments at Tokyo Hagashiyamato Grand Bowl.


he moved back to Hennessy OK. Marlene Schaefer and her daughter Brianna Doss live in Oklahoma City, OK.


